THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU)

Between

Nanaji Deshmukh Veterinary Science University, Administrative building, Adhartal, Jabalpur-482004 (M.P.) herein referred to as NDVSU, an ICAR accredited University situated in the heart of the country, committed to educate students through high quality teaching and research. NDVSU has a focussed institutional research strategy along with inter institutional collaboration need to be developed to address global, national and regional challenges

And

2. Rajasthan University of Veterinary and Animal Science, Bikaner, (RAJUVAS), an ICAR accredited State Veterinary University, Bikaner, Rajasthan, India-334001 herein after referred to as "RAJUVAS", with a dedicated mandate of teaching, research and extension in Veterinary and its allied subjects

Both the parties are desirous of signing a Memorandum of Undertaking (MOU) to strengthen their academic and research programme. For mutual benefit of the NDVSU and RAJUVAS, there will be the exchange of scientists, faculty members and students to facilitate academic activities. NDVSU and RAJUVAS will work closely to generate appropriate trained manpower through organization of symposia, guest lectures, short term training courses, formal academic curricula and other such activities.

Both NDVSU and RAJUVAS jointly agree:

- 1. To undertake joint research projects in the areas of mutual interest.
- 2. To share the facilities for carrying out collaborative research and other academic programmes on operating basis.
- 3. To organize academic activities and development programmes of mutual interest potentially beneficial and agreed by both the Universities.
- 4. To share laboratory, research farm, library and other supporting facilities for joint research projects as well as for students.
- To facilitate and coordinate student research work and permitting the faculty to be member/ co-advisor of advisory committee(s) for teaching and guiding students of both the Universities.
- 6. To facilitate and coordinate internee students of undergraduate programme in clinical as well as non clinical subjects including livestock farm practices and other supporting facilities. The content of the internship Program and the manner in which the student will be assigned is to be determined through consultation between both the Universities.
- 7. The student's internship supervisor at the host organization/institution is to be determined by consultation between both the Universities. The internship

supervisor undertakes to report back to Parent University on the student's progress over the course of the Program. The student's faculty supervisor at Parent University is to monitor the student's progress in terms of how the Program fulfils his/her training goals. To this end, the faculty supervisor undertakes to visit the student at least once at the host University during the internship period in order to directly observe the student's progress.

- 8. The internee must submit an internship report to both the host University internship supervisor and parent University faculty supervisor at the end of his/her internship period.
- 9. The matter of remuneration paid to the student during the period of internship is to be monitored by the parent University and should be according to their rules and regulations.
- 10. Students will be responsible for their own transportation to and from the host institution, as well as for their room board, insurance and any other necessary fees while attending the host institution.
- 11. To share research results and publish jointly in collaborative and networking projects.
- 12. Any IPR emerging from collaborative project will be the property of both the Universities in proportion to contribution of the investigators, as per Government of India rules.
- 13. In case of projects not supported formally by an extramural grant, but otherwise to by the two Universities, the parties shall meet their respective expenses which they might incur while carrying out their respective agreed obligation.
- 14. Both the Universities shall explore possibilities for collaboration, cooperation, coordination and networking of mutually understandable program.
- 15. Neither of the parties shall claim the usage of facilities/software or other services as a matter of right. It would be subject to availability, but would not be ordinarily refused.
- 16. This MoU is non-binding, non-enforceable and non financial ramification, but rather a way of mutual understanding for increasing both Universities mutual synergic benefits.

Implementation

Both the Universities shall designate a liaison officer to develop and coordinate specific activities or programmes. The terms of such activity of mutual interest shall be discussed and agreed prior to the initiation of the activity. During operation, if any alteration/modification is required, the same may be mutually discussed and duly agreed upon in writing.

Timeline

This MoU will be effective from the date of its signing by both the parties shall remain in operation for a period of 5 (Five) years from the date of signing until one of the parties serve notice to the other for its intention to terminate it.

In such instances, the MoU will stand terminated 3 (three) months from the date of such notice. In case both the Universities agree to terminate the MoU, the ongoing research projects will be completed as per already signed MoU and agree obligations.

Renewal of the MoU

In case there is nothing to the contrary, this MoU shall continue to get renewed after mutual consent of both the parties, for the next term of 5 (five) years after the completion of one term.

Amendments

The Parties to this MoU may,	by mutual consent,	add, modify,	amend or	delete	any
words, phrases, sentences or	Articles in this MoU.
