With a view to provide education and training to the students of the University in democratic way of running the institutions in the University, this constitution is given below:-

This Constitution is prepared with the guidelines provided in the letter of Principal Secretary (Higher Education) Department of Education (Gr.4), Government of Rajasthan, (No.F3(4) Edu,4/2002 part dated 25.6.2010 on the lines of Lyngdoh Committee recommendations accepted by Hon'ble Supreme Court.

## CHAPTER I:

1. There shall be a Union of all the students of constituent colleges of the Rajasthan University of Veterinary \& Animal Sciences, Bikaner to be known as "STUDENTS' UNION OF THE RAJASTHAN UNIVERSITY OF VETERINARY AND ANIMAL SCIENCES", hereinafter referred to as 'Union'

2(a) All bonafide regular students studying in various degree and diploma programmmes in constituent colleges of the University will be members of the Union.

Foreign, in-service and students enrolled in short term, certificate courses or the courses of less than one year shall not be members of the Union.
(b) Student shall deposit an annual approved subscription fee for entitling him to the membership of the Union.

3 The Union shall function within the frame work of the Rajasthan University of Veterinary \& Animal Sciences Act, 2010 Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations framed thereunder.
$4 \quad$ Definitions
i) 'Academic Council' means the Academic Council of the Rajasthan University of Veterinary \& Animal Sciences, Bikaner.
ii) 'Act' means ' The Rajasthan University of Veterinary \& Animal Sciences Act, 2010.
iii) 'Chief Patron' means the Vice-Chancellor of the Rajasthan University of Veterinary \& Animal Sciences, Bikaner
iv) 'Conduct Probation' means the conduct probation as defined under the rules of the Rajasthan University of Veterinary \& Animal Sciences, Bikaner detailed in the University Bulletin/Information Bulletin of Colleges as in force for the time being.
v) 'Statutes, Ordinances \& Regulations' means the Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations of the Rajasthan University of Veterinary \& Animal Sciences, Bikaner.
vi) 'Student' means a person enrolled as a full time student for a degree or diploma programme in the University as provided in 2(a).
vii) 'Union' means 'Rajasthan University of Veterinary \& Animal Sciences Students Union and includes the whole body of the students, who have voting right as per Article-2 (a) and 2(b)
viii) 'University' means the Rajasthan University of Veterinary \& Animal Sciences, Bikaner.
ix) 'Vice-Chancellor' means the Vice-Chancellor of the Rajasthan University of Veterinary \& Animal Sciences, Bikaner

## 5. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE UNION:

i) To educate and train the students of the University in running the students bodies in the colleges/institution in the democratic way.
ii). To provide education and training to the students for their role as ideal citizens of the country.
iii) To provide for the achievement of the objectives of the University relevant to teaching, research and extension.
iv) To provide for social, cultural and intellectual development of the students.
v) To provide for the promotion of healthy relations between the students, teachers and other employees of the University.
vi) To promote a healthy and orderly corporate life in the University.
6. ACTIVITIES OF THE UNION:-

The activities of the Union shall consist of:
i) Organizing debates, lectures, discussions, study circle, essay competitions, cultural and other contests etc.
ii) Publication in furtherance of education.
iii) Social service and activities.
iv) Organizing and running students activities.
v) Such other activities as approved by the Chief Patron or any other officers nominated by him in this behalf.

## 7. CONSTITUTION OF COUNCIL OF UNION:

There shall be a Council of Students' Union consisting of:
i. $\quad$ Elected members

President, Vice-President, General Secretary and Joint Secretary-cum-Treasurer and University Representative elected according to the procedure detailed in Article-10

## Ex-officio members

President and General Secretaries of the various students' bodies (council/association) of the colleges of the University elected as per rules framed by the Colleges.
8. The Chief Electoral Officer for the election of the candidates for the Students' Union and the Returning Officers for the colleges (Association) shall be nominated by Chief Patron.
9. POWERS, FUNCTIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF OFFICEBEARERS OF THE UNION :
A. President :
i) The President shall be the Chief Executive of the Union and shall preside over its meetings unless the Chief Patron or his representative is present in which case the meeting shall be presided over by Chief Patron or his representative. In case of absence of the President in a meeting, the General Secretary will preside over the meeting and in case he/she is also not present, then, the Joint Secretary-cumTreasurer will preside over it.
ii) It shall be the duty of the President to ensure the complete fulfillment of the aims and objectives of the Union.
iii) The President shall have the power to convene meetings after giving notice of 7 clear days.
iv) It will be the responsibility of the President to conduct the affairs of the union as per the Act, Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations of the University.

## B. Vice-President:

i) The Vice-President will assist the President in discharging his duties.
ii) In the absence of the President, and after authorization by the President or President ceases to be the student of the University, Vice-President will perform the duties of the President.

## C. General Secretary

i) The General Secretary shall be the custodian of all records of the Union.
ii) The General Secretary shall issue notices to the members of the Union for its meetings giving the items of the agenda and the date and time and venue of the meetings with the approval of the President.
iii) The General Secretary shall be responsible for the preparation and issue of the agenda, minutes and proceedings of all the meetings of the Union.
D. Joint Secretary-Cum-Treasurer
i) He shall prepare the annual budget in consultation with the President and General Secretary for its approval by the Union.
ii) He shall be responsible for proper maintenance, upkeep and submission of the accounts of the union.
iii) He shall be responsible for the proper maintenance of all the materials and stores of the Union.

## CHAPTER-II ELECTION

10 (i) Election of the Union will be held by secret ballot at different stages
ii) The procedure of election will be as follows :-

There will be a direct election for the following posts:-

1. President
2. Vice-President
3. General Secretary
4. Joint Secretary-cum-Treasurer
5. University Representatives (UR)
(One UR for every 200 students or part of it)
iii) The candidate securing the highest number of valid votes will be declared elected. If two or more candidates secure the same numbers of votes, election of President/Vice-President/General Secretary/Joint Secretary/ University

Representative, as the case may be, will be decided by draw of lots by the Chief Electoral Officer.

11 No act done or proceedings under this Constitution shall be questioned on the ground of the existence of any vacancy in any body like Union/VSA club etc. as recognized by the University.

The Chief Electoral Officer for the Union and the Returning Officer will announce the detailed time schedule for the conduct of elections, which shall be at least 7 days before the date of polling of the office bearers.

All the members, elected or ex-officio, mentioned in Article -7 shall be administered oath of office (Annexure-I) and of the Constitution before assuming the charge.

Appeal against election results of any candidate of a post in the Union, aggrieved with the result of its election can be filed in writing to the Tribunal through the Returning Officer against the result upto 5. 00 PM of the second day of the results is declared.

The decision of the Tribunal on the appeal shall be final and binding.

## 15. TENURE:

The tenure of an office-bearer shall commence from the date of his election and he will cease to hold office on $\mathbf{1 5}^{\text {th }}$ May of that academic year or on the day he/she ceases to be on the rolls of the college, whichever is earlier.

## 16. ELIGIBILITY TO VOTE

All members of the Union eligible as per article 2(a) and (b) will be eligible to cast vote for Union elections.

## 17. ELIGIBILITY TO CONTEST ELECTION

All the members as under Article-16 will be eligible to contest the election provided that they fulfill the following criteria also:-
(a) Age Limit:-
(i) For graduate students- 17-24 years
(ii) For post-graduate students - upto 25 years
(iii) For Ph.D.students - upto 28 years
(b) There should not be any academic arrear to the student contesting the election. A student stayed beyond the normal stipulated period required for his degree programme is not eligible to contest the election.
(c) Attendance requirement should be $75 \%$ in the class in which a candidate is studying.
(d) A candidate can contest the election of the office-bearers of the Union once in his degree programme and can contest election of executive members twice.
(e) A candidate should not have any criminal records which mean he/she had not been tried for an act of crime or prosecuted by any Court of Law.
(f) There should not be any instance of disciplinary action against him/her by the college or university administration.
(g) The candidate should be a full time student of the University .
(h) A student who is on conduct probation at the time of his nomination will not be eligible for contesting.
(i) A student who has been convicted of moral turpitude in a criminal case or has been punished by University authorities for indiscipline, mis-conduct or misbehaviour can not contest the election.
(j) A student should not be a defaulter in respect of payment of his college/hostel dues.
(j) A student should not be expelled or rusticated by the University for any period. This disqualification shall, however, also apply even if the order of his expulsion or rustication has been withdrawn by the University.
(k) A candidate can not contest election for more than one post of the Union.
(1) A student who has ceased to be on the rolls of the University for any other reasons whatsoever will be disqualified for contesting.
(m) A student pursuing research work in the fourth semester of MVSc (PG) and $3^{\text {rd }}$ and onwards semesters in Ph.D. will not be eligible to be a candidate.
(n) $\quad \mathrm{He} /$ she should have secured at least $65 \%$ marks in the previous class or the last class whose result has been declared.

## EXPLANATION :-

A student will be guilty of gross misconduct, if he
i) is expelled from the University
ii) is accused of a non-bailable offence.
iii) is disqualified under unfairmeans rules in the university examinations.
iv) brings a bad name to the University by his mis-conduct on or outside the campus.
v) destroys or mutilates university property.
vi) prevents any university officials from performing his normal duties or assaults any official of the University.

## For the Post of President

Only members from the fourth and final year Bachelor Programme and members from the PG and Ph.D. Programmes will be so entitled as provided in this Constitution.

## 18. DISQUALIFICATION OF CONTINUATION TO HOLD OFFICE :

The office-bearers of the Union shall earn disqualification, if he/she earns disqualification under Article-17 and shall cease to remain office-bearer.

## 19. BARRING JURISDICTION OF COURT OF LAW :

The decision regarding eligibility, disqualifications, results and conduct shall not be questioned in any Court of Law.

## 20. FINANCIAL LIABILITY AND ELECTION RELATED EXPENDITURE

i) A candidate is restricted to spend upto maximum Rs.5,000/- as election related expenditure.
ii) Every candidate must submit a Statement of complete Expenditure incurred in the election within two weeks of the declaration of the results to DSW/ADSW whichever applicable.
iii) DSW/ADSW will notify the statement of expenditure of the candidates within two days of the receipt of the statement. Members of student's body can examine the expenditure statement of any candidate..
iv) A candidate's election will be null and void if it is found that his expenditure on elections is more than Rs.5000/-.
v) Monetary contribution from political parties and other organizations is strictly prohibited except voluntarily contributions from the students.
vi) Every student entitled to be a member of the Union shall pay union membership fees, to be determined from time to time by the University/College, as annual subscription along with his other fees at the time of his/her registration in the academic year.
vii) $60 \%$ of the collection of the union subscription will be at the disposal of the college association/club etc. and the rest $40 \%$ shall form a part of the funds of the Union.
viii) The annual budget of the Union shall be prepared by its Joint-Secretary-cumTreasurer in consultation with the President within one month of its election. The budget shall then be presented to the Council to be passed by majority vote. The budget will become effective after it is approved by the Chief Patron subject to availability of funds accrued out of union fee etc. The University shall not be
able to provide any additional grant except in exigencies subject to satisfaction of the Chief Patron on the recommendations of DSW/ADSW.
ix) The Joint Secretary-cum-Treasurer will present a statement of audited annual expenditure of the Union in its Annual Meeting.
x) Each candidate for each post has to deposit a security money of Rs.500/- while filing his/her nomination. A receipt in this behalf may be given to the candidate mentioning the Receipt No. on the nomination form. This amount shall be refundable to candidates getting $1 / 6$ th or more of the total votes casted for that particular post. The candidate getting less than $1 / 6^{\text {th }}$ of the total votes casted shall forfeit their security. The names of candidates loosing security shall be notified by the Chief Electoral Officer. Candidates withdrawing their nomination will get the refund of the security money.

## 21. CODE OF CONDUCT DURING TENURE OF OFFICE AND ELECTION

i) No candidate shall indulge in, nor shall abet, any activity, which may aggravate existing differences or create mutual hatred or cause tension between different castes and communities, religious or linguistic, or between any group(s) of students.
ii) Criticism of other candidates, when made, shall be confined to their policies and programs, past record and work. Candidates shall refrain from criticism of all aspects of private life, not connected with the public activities of the other candidates or supporters of such other candidates. Criticism of other candidates, or their supporters based on unverified allegations or distortion shall be avoided.
iii) There shall be no appeal on the basis of caste or communal feelings for securing votes. Places of worship, within or out of the campus shall not be used for election propaganda.
iv) All candidates shall be prohibited from indulging or abetting, all activities which are considered to be "corrupt practices" and offences, such as bribing of voters, intimidation of voters, impersonation of voters, canvassing or the use of propaganda means within 100 meters of polling stations, holding public meetings during the period of 24 hours ending with the hour fixed for the close of the poll campaign and the transport and conveyance of voters to and from polling station.
v) No candidate shall be permitted to make use of printed posters, printed pamphlets, or any other printed material for the purpose of canvassing. Candidates may only utilize hand-made posters for the purpose of canvassing, provided that such handmade posters are procured within the expenditure limit set out herein above (These should not be of bad taste or vulgar)
vi) Candidates may only utilize hand-made posters at specified places in the campus, which shall be notified in advance by Chief Electoral Officer / university authority.
vii) No candidate shall be permitted to carry out processions, or public meetings, or in any way canvass or distribute propaganda items outside the university/college campus.
viii) No candidate shall, nor shall his/her supporters, deface or cause any destruction to any property of the university / college campus including hostels, for any purpose whatsoever. All candidates shall be held jointly and severally liable for any destruction / defacing of any university /college property, and shall be accordingly liable for punishment and/or penalty and also FIR can be lodged for defacement of property under relevant Act (s).
ix) During the election period the candidates may hold processions and /or public meetings, provided that such processions and / or public meetings do not, in any manner, disturb the classes and other academic and co curricular activities of the college / university. Further, such procession / public meeting may not be held without the prior written permission of the college / university authority and shall be restricted to the campus only.
x) The use of loudspeakers, vehicles ( three and four wheelers) and animals for the purpose of canvassing shall be prohibited.
xi) The Union or any of its bodies or any office bearers shall have no contact with any political party or organization so far as the activities of the union and other University bodies are concerned.
xii) The Council shall not be authorized to take up the issues/ cases of individual students. The Council shall not be authorized to take up issues related to conduct rules, attendance, unfairmeans or other such cases which are decidable on the basis of rules and regulations of the University.
xiii) The Council or any of its bodies shall not act on a call given by any political party or agency.
xiv) If a member of the Union indulges in an act of indiscipline or misbehaves towards either a staff member or any member of his family, the concerned College Students Council/Club/Association shall condemn this activity. If students of more than one colleges are involved, the act shall be condemned by the Council.
xv) The Union or any of its bodies shall not organize any procession or demonstration against any individual employee. No procession or demonstration or any type shall be taken to the residential areas in the campus.
xvi) The Union and its various bodies and office-bearers shall be responsible to extend cooperation to the University authorities in maintaining discipline and peaceful atmosphere in the University. The Union and its members shall endeavour to maintain a good name and reputation of the University.
xvii) The members of the Union shall not organize or participate in any strike, demonstration, dharna gherao etc. on any issue that has not been referred to and considered by the appropriate authority in accordance with the procedure laid down.
xviii) The Council, its various bodies of office-bearers shall not misinterpret or indulge in false propaganda against University policies/ decisions.

## 22. POWERS AND FUNCTIONS OF CHIEF PARTRON

i) The Chief Patron shall ensure that the Union and its various bodies function in accordance with provisions of this Constitution.
ii) The Chief Patron or any other person nominated by him/her, on his behalf, shall have the right to attend any meeting, when he shall also chair it.
iii) If, at any time, the Chief Patron finds that a situation has arisen whereunder the Council cannot function according to the provisions of this Constitution, he may suspend the Council. The period of suspension shall not exceed one month and at the end thereof, he shall have the discretion either to revoke the order of suspension or dissolve the Council.
iv) The Chief Patron can amend the Constitution and election procedure whenever necessary.
v) The Chief Patron may delegate any or all his powers to any officer of the University.
23. IDENDITY CARD

The students are required to carry Identity Card for entry to the premises and issue of ballot papers.

## 24. MEETING

i) The General Secretary shall convene all ordinary meetings of the Union. At least 7 days before the date of the meeting, he/she shall in consultation the President issue notice and agenda papers for the meetings. After the meeting, within three days, he/she will issue proceedings of the meeting.
ii) Authenticated copy of all agenda items to be considered at any such meetings, shall be sent simultaneously by the General Secretary to the Chief Patron. Later, after the meeting, within three days, authenticated copy of the proceedings of the meeting shall be sent to the Chief Patron.
iii) The quorum for meeting of the Council will be $1 / 3 \mathrm{rd}$ of total number of councilors, fraction being rounded off to next whole number.
iv) A special meeting of the Council will be convened by the President provided such a meeting is requisitioned through a written request signed by not less than one third of the total strength of council. Such a special meeting shall transact only such business for which it was requisitioned.
25. There shall be a Staff Advisor to the Council nominated by the Chief Patron for the academic year who may advise and guide the Council, wherever
necessary and may attend its meeting. Copies of all notices and circulars shall be sent to the Staff Advisor.

## 26 Grievance Redressal Mechanism

26. 1 There should be a Grievances Redressal Cell with the Dean (Student Welfare) / teacher in charge of student affairs as its chairman. In addition, one senior faculty member, one senior administrative officer and two final year students one boy and one girl (till the election results declared, students can be nominated on the basis of merit and/or participation in the co-curricular activities in the previous year). The grievance cell shall be mandated with the redressal of election-related grievances, including, but not limited to breaches of the code of conduct of elections and complaints relating to election related expenditure. This cell would be the regular unit of the institution.
26.2 In pursuit of its duties, the grievance cell may prosecute violators of any aspect of the code of conduct or the rulings of the grievance cell. The grievance cell shall serve as the court of original jurisdiction. The institutional head shall have appellate jurisdiction over issues of law and fact in all cases or controversies arising out of the conduct of the elections in which the grievance cell has issued a final decision. Upon review, the institutional head may revoke or modify the sanctions imposed by the grievance cell
26.3 In carrying out the duties of the office, the Grievance cell shall conduct proceedings and hearings necessary to fulfill those duties. In executing those duties they shall have the authority: (i) to issue a writ of subpoena to compel candidates, agents, and workers, and to request students to appear and give testimony, as well as produce necessary records; and (ii) to inspect the financial reports of any candidate and make these records available for public scrutiny upon request.
26.4 Members of the Grievance cell are prohibited from filing complaints. Any other student may file a complaint with the Grievance cell, within a period of 3 weeks from the date of declaration of results. All complaints must be filed under the name of the student filing the complaint. The Grievance cell shall act on all complaints within 24 hours after they are received by either dismissing them or calling a hearing.
26.5 The Grievance cell may dismiss a complaint if:
(i) the complaint was not filed within the time frame prescribed in Recommendation 26.4 above;
(ii) the complaint fails to state a cause of action for which relief may be granted;
(iii) the complainant has not and / or likely will not suffer injury or damage.
26.6 If a complaint is not dismissed, then a hearing must be held. The Grievance cell shall inform, in writing, or via e-mail, the complaining party and all individuals or groups named in the complaint of the time and place of the hearing. The parties are not considered notified until they have received a copy of the complaint.

The hearing shall be held at the earliest possible time, but not within twentyfour (24) hours after receipt of the notice described above, unless all parties agree to waive the 24 -hour time constraint.
26.8 At the time notice of a hearing is issued, the Grievance cell, by majority vote, may issue a temporary restraining order, if it determines that such action is necessary to prevent undue or adverse effects on any individual or entity. Any restraining order, once issued, will remain in effect until a decision of the Grievance cell is announced after the hearing or until rescinded by the Grievance cell.
26.9 All Grievance cell hearings, proceedings, and meetings must be open to the public.
26.10 All Parties of the Grievance cell hearing shall present themselves at the hearing, may be accompanied by any other student from which they can receive counsel, and have the option to be represented by that counsel.
26.11 For any hearing, a majority of sitting Grievance cell members must be in attendance with the Chair of the Grievance cell presiding. In the absence of the Chair, the responsibility to preside shall fall to a Grievance cell member designated by the Chair.
26.12 The Grievance cell shall determine the format for the hearing, but must require that both the complaining and responding parties appear physically before the board to discuss the issues through a complaint, answered, rebuttal, and rejoinder format. The purpose of the hearing is to gather the information necessary to make a decision, order, or ruling that will resolve an election dispute. To effectuate this purpose, the following rules should prevail at all hearings:

- Complaining parties shall be allowed no more than two witnesses, however the Grievance cell may call witnesses as required. If said witnesses are unable to appear at the hearing, signed affidavits may be submitted the Grievance cell Chair for the purpose of testifying by proxy.
- All questions and discussions by the parties in dispute shall be directed to the Grievance cell.
- There shall be no direct or cross-examination of any party or witness by complaining or responding parties during hearings.
- Reasonable time limits may be set by the Grievance cell, provided they give fair and equal treatment to both sides.
- The complaining party shall bear the burden of proof.
- Decisions, orders, and rulings of the Grievance cell must be concurred to by a majority of the Grievance cell present and shall be announced as soon as possible after the hearing. The Grievance cell shall issue a written opinion of the ruling within 12 hours of announcement of the decision. The written opinion must set forth the findings of fact by the Grievance cell and the conclusions of law in support of it.

Written opinions shall set a precedent for a time period of three election cycles for Grievance cell rulings, and shall guide the Grievance cell in its proceedings. Upon consideration of prior written opinions, the grievance cell may negate the decision, but must provide written documentation of reasons for doing so.

- If the decision of the Grievance cell is appealed to the institutional head, the Grievance cell must immediately submit its ruling to the commission.
- The Grievance cell shall select the remedy or sanction most appropriate to both the type and severity of the infraction, as well as the state of mind or intent of the violator as determined by the Grievance cell. Possible remedies and sanctions include, but are not limited to, fines, suspension of campaigning privileges, and disqualification from the election.
- Any fine or total amount of fines against a candidate in an election cycle may not exceed the spending limit as defined herein above.
- If, after a hearing, the Grievance cell finds that provisions of this Code were violated by a candidate, or a candidate's agents or workers, the Grievance cell may restrict the candidate, or the candidates agents or workers, from engaging in some or all campaign activities for some or all of the remainder of the campaign. If an order is issued covering only part of the remaining campaign period, it shall take effect immediately so that after its termination, the candidate will have an opportunity to resume campaigning during the days immediately prior to and including the election days.
- If, after a hearing, the Grievance cell finds that provisions of either this Code or decisions, opinions, orders, or rulings of the Grievance cell have been willfully and blatantly violated by a candidate, or a candidate's agents or workers, the Grievance cell may disqualify the candidate.
- Any party adversely affected by a decision of the Grievance cell may file an appeal with the institutional head within twenty-four (24) hours after the adverse decision is announced. The institutional head shall have discretionary appellate jurisdiction over the Grievance cell in all cases in which error on the part of the Grievance cell is charged.
- The decision of the Grievance cell shall stand and shall have full effect until the appeal is heard and decided by the institutional head.
- The institutional head shall hear appeals of Grievance cell rulings as soon as possible, but not within twenty-four (24) hours after the Grievance cell delivers to the Appellant and the institutional head a copy of its written opinion in the case. Appeal may be heard prior to this time, but only if the Appellant waives the right to a written opinion and the institutional head agrees to accept the waiver.
- The institutional head can issue suitable orders to suspend or halt the operation of the ruling issued by the Grievance cell until the appeals are decided.
- The institutional head shall review findings of the Grievance cell when appealed. The institutional head may affirm or overturn the decision of the Grievance cell, or modify the sanctions imposed.


## 27 Maintaining Law and Order on the Campus during the Election Process

27.1 Any instance of acute lawlessness or the commission of a criminal offence shall be reported to the police by the university / college authorities as soon as possible, within 12 hours after the alleged commission of the offence.

## 28. Miscellaneous

28.1 Student representation is essential to the overall development of students, and, therefore, it is recommended that university statutes should expressly provide for student representation.
28.2 Student representation should be regulated by statute (either a Central Statue, State Statute or individual university statutes), incorporating the recommendations prescribed herein.
28.3 The institution should organize leadership-training programs with the help of professional organizations so as to groom and instill in students leadership qualities.
28.4 In the event of the office of any major post of office bearer falling vacant within two months of elections, re-elections should be conducted; otherwise the Vice President may be promoted to the post of President and Joint Secretary to the post of Secretary, as the case may be.

## 29 Interpretation of Constitution

Any doubt or dispute regarding the interpretation of any provision of this Constitution or any other matter not covered explicity/implicity by this Constitution, shall be referred to the Chief Patron whose decision in this respect shall be final and binding.

## 30. Amendment of Constitution

Proposal for amendment to this Constitution can be moved by only Dean, Students' Welfare at the University / Asstt.Dean Students Welfare at the college level.
31. Permission of Chief Patron is mandatory for inviting any dignitary for Union functions.
