

were observed as non-significant on brucellosis diagnosed by i-ELISA. Molecular diagnostic technique (Conventional PCR) was applied for the detection of *Brucella* spp. in sero-positive samples. five samples gave positive PCR results for insertion sequence IS711 with product size of 494bp which confirms the *Brucella abortus* in all 5 samples.

43. Comparative Evaluation of Normal and Cataractous Eyes in Dogs Using B-Mode Ultrasonography

Ultrasonography is a relatively simple, effective, non-invasive and inexpensive form of examination that can be used as a supplement to regular ophthalmic examination in the diagnosis of ocular and orbital disorders. The present clinical study entitled "Comparative Evaluation of Normal and Cataractous Eyes in Dogs Using B-Mode Ultrasonography" was conducted on clinically 20 normal and 20 cataractous eyes of dogs of different breeds of mesocephalic skull group reported during study period. The ultra-sonographic evaluations of internal structures of the normal and cataractous eyes were performed using a linear transducer (3-13 MHz) at 13 MHz frequency and 4 cm scanning depth with suitable gain by trans corneal approach. Trans corneal intraocular echo-biometric study of four parameters i.e., aqueous chamber depth (ACD), lens thickness (LT), vitreous chamber depth (VCD) and axial globe length (AGL) was performed. This study provided anecho-biometric view of the inner ocular structures in normal and cataractous eyes in dogs of different breeds of mesocephalic skull group. No significant difference was found in parameters like Anterior chamber depth (ACD), lens thickness (LT) and vitreous chamber depth (VCD) among position of eye, sex and age within normal and cataractous eyes of dogs. The values of axial globe length (AGL) were higher in cataractous eyes than normal eyes of mesocephalic skull group dogs.



44. Evaluation of MSICS Technique for Treatment of Cataract by Comparing the Refractive State of Phakic Eyes with Aphakic and Pseudophakic Eyes in Dogs

Present clinical study was conducted on 32 dogs (20 healthy and 12 cataractous) of different breeds of either sex. Dogs having cataract were randomly divided in two groups and operated using MSICS (modified Blumenthal's technique). A detailed ophthalmic

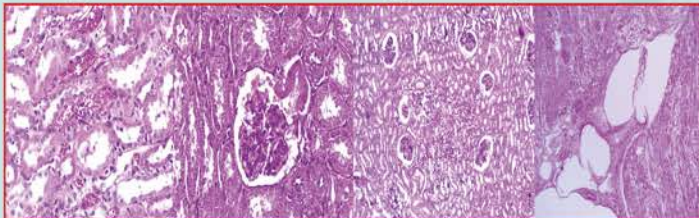
examination including ultrasonography and routine haemato-biochemical analysis were performed in all the dogs. Ophthalmic diagnostic protocol opted in present study was found helpful in diagnosis of cataract in dogs. Establishment of wet lab helped in reducing learning curve for MSICS technique and provided risk free environment without an imminent failure or complication. Anaesthetic protocol was tailored using glycopyrrolate, diazepam, ketamine, propofol and isoflurane. Retrobulbar deposition of mixture of normal saline and lignocaine behind the globe was used to fix the globe. Intraoperative complications were chemosis, miosis, excessive scleral bleeding, zonular dehiscence, luxation of lens into anterior chamber, intraocular haemorrhage and big nucleus size in one case needed the enlargement of the tunnel. Post-operative complications included corneal opacity, scleral congestion and vitreal degeneration. Ambulatory vision was recorded in 9 out of 12 eyes (75%). Streak retinoscopy was performed to evaluate the refractive state of the 40 healthy phakic eyes of 20 dogs. Refractive state of healthy eyes of 20 dogs with normal vision was compared with pseudophakic (6) and aphakic (6) eyes. Hand held streak retinoscope was helpful in the estimation of refractive status of healthy as well in post-operative pseudophakic and aphakic eyes. Out of 40 healthy phakic eyes 23 (57.50%) eyes were emmetropic. Out of 20 dogs 3 (15%) were hyperopic, 6 (30%) dogs were myopic while 11 (55%) dogs were emmetropic. Only one dog out of 20 was found to be anisometropic. Statistically significant difference was present in refractometric values between the operated pseudophakic and aphakic eyes of group-II and III ($p < 0.05$). Use of +41D intraocular lens helped in reducing the hypermetropia in all pseudophakic eyes but still remained hyperopic. For evaluation of MSICS technique refractive state of healthy eyes was compared with aphakic and pseudophakic eyes. Qualitative evaluation of vision after cataractous lens extraction using MSICS technique and dogs having ambulatory vision was easily done with streak retinoscopy which makes MSICS a suitable technique for cataract removal having other merits like wider applicability, better safety, with a shorter learning curve and lower cost.



45. A Study on Occurrence and Pathology of various Conditions in Urinary System of Goats (*Capra hircus*) in Jaipur

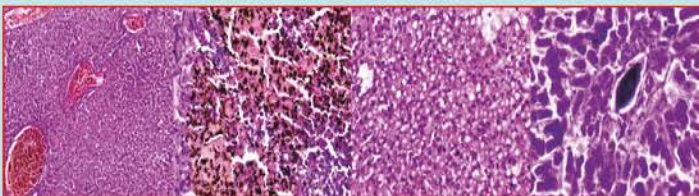
India is holding 1st rank in total livestock population in world and 27.80% of which is contributed by goats. As per 20th Livestock census, and BAHS (2019) India's livestock sector is one of the largest in the world and there is 10.1% increase in goat population over the previous census with Rajasthan having total goat population of 20.8 million. To obtain maximum gain from goat rearing, it is vitally important that the goat should be reared in healthy and productive environment. Still, goats may suffer from infectious and non-

infectious diseases. Various pathogenic organisms and toxins enter the blood stream and pass through the kidneys. So, diagnosis of diseases of urinary system and their control will definitely improve the potential of goat to improve the national economy. The data pertaining to the conditions of urinary system in goat in Rajasthan is scarce, so pathological study of urinary system is very important as renal diseases are likely to bear a major segment of total burden of diseases. Kidney being the major organ of urinary system, was the major target organ of study and tissues from associated structures like ureter, urinary bladder and urethra were collected only if grossly suspected for abnormalities. A total of 135 samples of kidneys and 38 samples of lower urinary tract were collected and further processed for histopathological examination by classical H & E technique. The overall occurrence of various pathological conditions of goat urinary system were observed and classified for kidney pathologies were Congestion 18.52 per cent, Haemorrhage 8.15 per cent, Hydronephrosis 1.48 per cent, Hyaline Degeneration 6.66 per cent, Renal Amyloidosis 2.96 per cent, Tubular Nephrosis 3.70 per cent, Acute Glomerulonephritis 8.15 per cent, Sub-acute Glomerulonephritis 9.62 per cent, Chronic Glomerulonephritis 5.92 per cent, Diffuse Interstitial Nephritis 14.81 per cent, Focal Interstitial Nephritis 11.85 per cent, Pyelonephritis 5.18 per cent, Renal Abscess 1.48 per cent and Retention Cyst 1.48 per cent. The incidence of various pathologies of lower urinary tract observed were Ureteritis 2.63 per cent, Acute Cystitis 7.89 per cent, Chronic Cystitis 2.63 per cent and Urethritis 2.63 per cent. Study concluded that circulatory disturbance, interstitial nephritis, and glomerulonephritis in kidney and acute cystitis in lower urinary tract were the main leading pathological conditions among goats in Jaipur.



46. A Study on Occurrence and Pathology of Various Conditions of Hepatobiliary System of Sheep (*Ovis aries*) in Jaipur

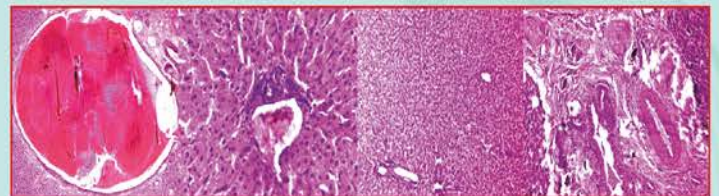
The present study was conducted from Jan 2023 to June 2023. A total 676 liver samples of sheep were examined irrespective to age, breed and sex. Out of these representative samples 269 liver samples showed gross lesions, were subjected to histopathological examinations. An overall occurrence of various pathological conditions was observed as 39.79 per cent. The detailed pathomorphological study of 269 samples, hepatic lesions revealed congestion 30 (11.15%), haemorrhages 21 (7.80%), hemosiderosis 9 (3.34%), thrombosis 3 (1.11%), cloudy swelling 24 (8.92%), hydropic degeneration 10 (3.71%), fatty change 9 (3.34%), amyloidosis 7 (2.60%), necrosis 19 (7.06%), bile duct



hyperplasia 15 (5.57%), metaplasia 11 (4.08%), atrophy 9 (3.34%), fasciolosis 9 (3.34%), cysticercosis 15 (5.57%), hydatidosis 10 (3.71%), acute hepatitis 12 (4.46%), chronic hepatitis 14 (5.20%), chronic hepatitis with cirrhosis 10 (3.71%), hepatic abscess 7 (2.60%), hepatic tuberculosis 6 (2.23%), telangiectasis 8 (2.97%), calcification 11 (4.08%), congestion in gall bladder 19 (44.18%), cholecystitis 24 (55.81%).

47. A Study on Occurrence and Pathomorphological Alterations in Liver of Goat (*Capra hircus*) in Jaipur

The liver being the major vital organ of the body, total blood volume which circulate throughout the body passes through the liver, kidney and lungs, so any infection or toxic element present in the blood directly affect or injures the liver. A decrease in its efficiency affects the general health condition and productivity of the animals. Hence the present study was undertaken with the objectives to find out the occurrence, etiology, type and pattern of different pathomorphological alterations of goat livers and the classification of these affections. The present study was carried out from June 2022 to December 2022. During this period, a total number of 712 liver samples of goats, irrespective of sex, age groups, and breeds were examined. Out of these representative samples, 253 liver samples showed gross lesions were subjected to histopathological examinations. An overall occurrence of various pathomorphological alterations of goats liver were observed as 35.53%. The Various form of liver affections were identified as: bile duct hyperplasia 5.13%, metaplasia 2.76%, atrophy 3.55%, hypertrophy 1.18%, congestion 7.50%, haemorrhages 5.13%, hemosiderosis, 3.55%, thrombosis 2.76%, cloudy swelling 7.90%, hydropic degeneration 4.34%, fatty changes 4.74%, amyloidosis 2.37%, coagulative necrosis 3.16%, caseous necrosis 0.39%, liquefactive necrosis 0.79%, acute hepatitis 4.34%, chronic hepatitis 2.76%, chronic hepatitis with cirrhosis 1.97%, hepatic abscess 1.58%, schistosomiasis 10.27%, cysticercosis 7.11%, hydatidosis 1.97%, *Escherichia coli* infection 5.92%, and clostridial infection 3.16%, systemic mycosis 0.79%, hepatocellular carcinomas 1.18%, hepatocellular adenoma 0.39%, telangiectasis 2.37% and calcification 0.79%. In conclusion, the present study revealed the spectrum of various pathomorphological alterations in the liver of goat in which cellular adaptation, circulatory disturbances, degenerative changes, necrosis, inflammatory changes, parasitic, bacterial, fungal infections, neoplasms and miscellaneous pathological conditions were the most common lesions noticed. On microbiological examination, *E. coli* was found to be the most common organism isolated. From the present study, it is evident that several predisposing factors like climatic conditions, stress, nutrition, immune status, infections, parasitic diseases and consumption of plant toxins might be responsible for the above pathomorphological alterations.

Teaching Veterinary Clinical Complex Activities

Veterinary Clinical Complex Activities: CVAS, Bikaner

The Veterinary clinical complex of College of Veterinary and Animal Science, Bikaner is having indoors, outdoors, dormitory and outpatient departments of major clinical departments viz. Department of Veterinary Medicine, Department of Veterinary Surgery & Radiology and Department of Veterinary Gynaecology and Obstetrics. The clinical complex is having richest clinical facilities like CT Scan, Ultra Sonography, laparoscopy, dentistry, laser surgery; apex centre for animal disease diagnosis, monitoring and surveillance etc. The faculty of these clinical departments is involved in providing treatment to sick animals and extending consultation to the livestock breeders/animal owners throughout the year.

Veterinary Clinical Complex Activities: CVAS, Navania

One of the major problems faced by the animal owners in the area is poor production of the animals due to occurrence of diseases and heavy mortality. There was lack of advanced diagnostic and treatment facilities in this area. The districts lying under Southern Rajasthan have 17.21 per cent livestock and 15.26 per cent poultry population of Rajasthan state (including 24.18 per cent cattle, 17.47 per cent buffalo, 9.55 per cent sheep and 16.34 per cent goats of Rajasthan). These districts were lacking advanced diagnostic, treatment, surveillance and monitoring facilities of animal diseases. With the aim to provide quick and effective disease diagnostic, surveillance and monitoring system by the veterinary specialists, it was proposed to establish a Veterinary Clinical Complex at College of Veterinary & Animal Sciences, Navania, Vallabhnagar, Udaipur.

Veterinary Clinical Complex Activities: PGIVER, Jaipur

The faculty of the institute at outdoor clinics of Veterinary Clinical Complex (VCC) have been involved in providing treatment to sick animals and extending consultation to the livestock breeders/animal owners throughout the year.

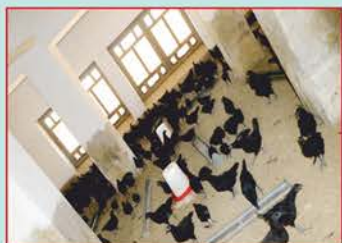

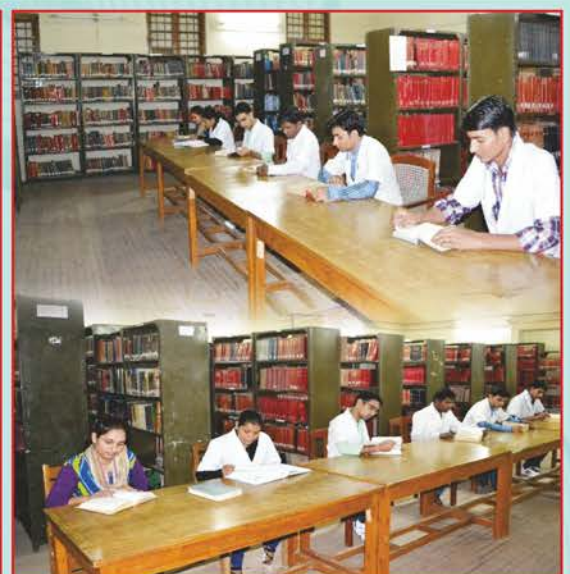
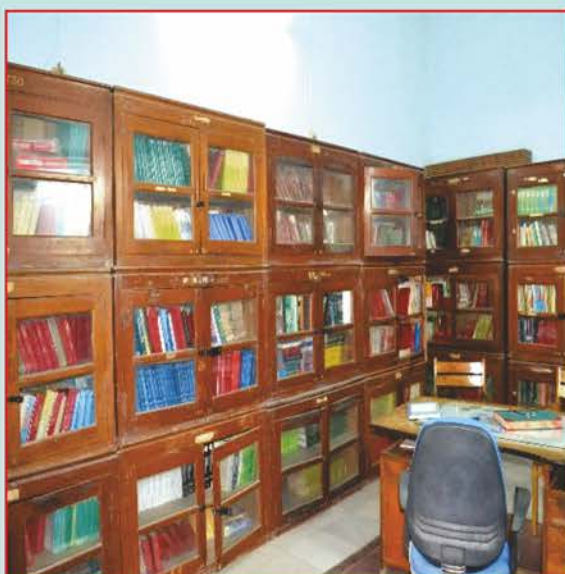
Library of CVAS, Bikaner

An ICAR sponsored 21 days winter school on "Animal Feed Safety and Quality Assessment to Ensure Safe Food of Animal Origin for Human Consumption" was organized from 5-25 February, 2024 by Department of Animal Nutrition, CVAS, Bikaner under the aegis of RAJUVAS, Bikaner. Dr. R.C. Agarwal, DDG (Agri. Edu.), ICAR, New Delhi was the Chief Guest and Dr. A.K. Gahlot, Former Vice-Chancellor, RAJUVAS, Bikaner was Guest of Honour in the Inaugural function on 5th February, 2024. Prof. Satish K. Garg Vice-Chancellor, RAJUVAS, Bikaner presided over the inaugural function. Twenty-three Assistant professors and scientists belonging to state agricultural and veterinary universities of nine states of the country including



Rajasthan, UP, MP, Punjab, Gujarat, Bihar, Assam, Tamilnadu, Uttarakhand and Delhi attended this winter school. In 21 days of this course total 52 lectures were delivered by the experts from RAJUVAS as well as ICAR institute located at Bikaner i.e. NRCC, NRCE, CSWRI and Lotus Dairy Pvt. Ltd. During Valedictory Session, Chief Guest of the function was Prof. (Dr.) N.S. Rathore, Former DDG (Agri Education), ICAR, New Delhi and Former Vice-Chancellor, MPUAT, Udaipur. 35. 37. The camp provided treatment for various diseases in animals like cows, buffaloes, goats, and camels. A total of 288 animals were treated during the camp, with 200 of them receiving mineral supplements and deworming medication to prevent malnutrition and internal parasites.



38. On February 25th, a dog show was organized at the college campus under the joint auspices of the College of Veterinary Science and Animal Science and the Canine Welfare Society, Bikaner. The dog show was attended by the IG Police, Bikaner Om Prakash as the chief guest and Prof. A.K. Gehlot, former Vice Chancellor, as the honorable guest. The organizing secretary of the dog show, Dr. J.P. Kachhawa, revealed that nearly 80 dog owners registered for various competitions in the dog show. The fancy dress competition, featuring various costumes and colorful decorations, captivated the audience. Trained dogs from the military showcased their skills and performed various tricks.



39. On February 26th, a awareness program was organized at Government Senior Secondary School Rampura Basti, Lalgarh, Bikaner by the Veterinary University's Biomedical Waste Management and Technology Center, Rajuvas. Dr. Deepika Dhudiya, the chief investigator of the Animal Biomedical Waste Management and Technology Center, explained to students about the harmful effects of organic waste from hospitals on



human health, and also informed them about the proper disposal of biomedical waste.

40. On 29th February, at the campus of Rajasthan College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences in Bikaner, the ground-breaking ceremony and inauguration of the Diagnostic Imaging Unit and Seminar Hall was done by the Vice Chancellor Prof. Satish K. Garg.



41. The Veterinary University's Animal Research Center in Chandan (Jaisalmer) organized a one-day awareness and animal breeding camp on Thursday under the Animal Husbandry Awareness Campaign of the Government of India. Dr. Vishnu Kumar Vijay, the center's in-charge officer, mentioned that a total of 250 livestock farmers participated in the camp. The camp treated various diseases of 105 animals and distributed mineral supplements and deworming medicines to 1378 animals.

42. 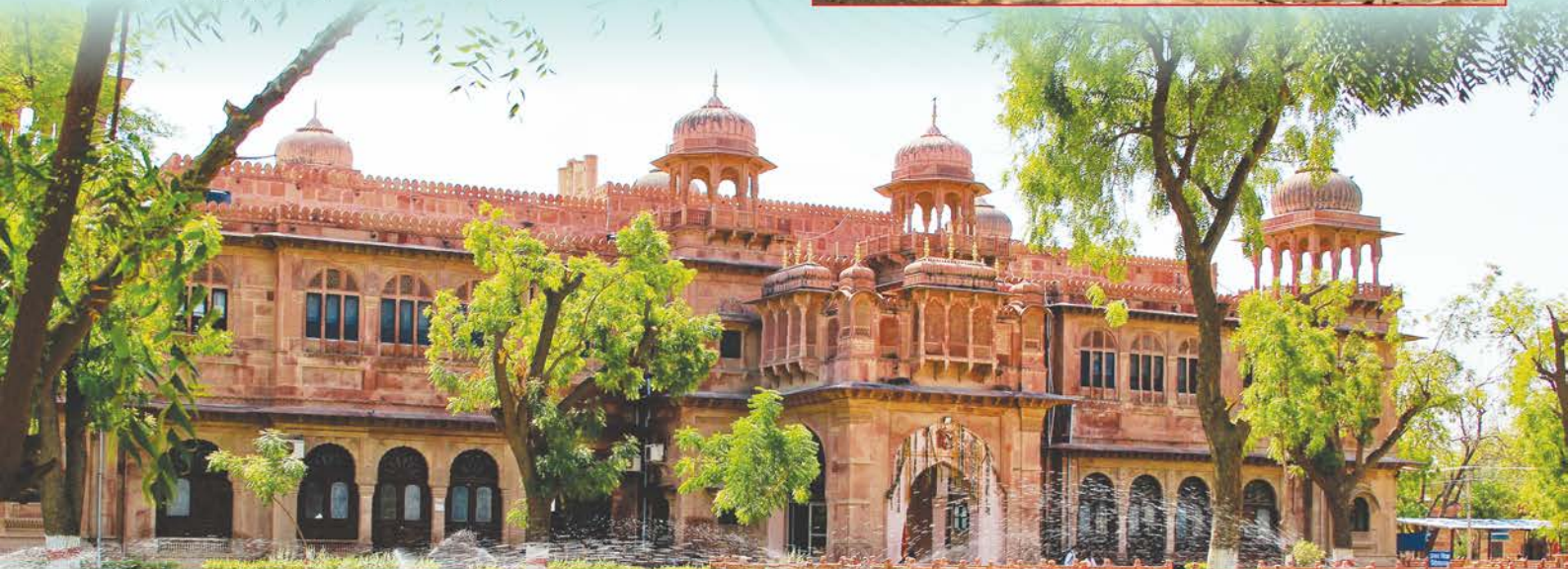

The structural framework of ground floor of the college building has been constructed. This phase involved the installation of columns, and concrete slabs, forming the skeleton of the building. Currently, Ground floor structural framework has been completed, with ongoing efforts to expedite the process.



NSS and NCC Activities

In order to inculcate the spirit of community service amongst students, there are three NSS units of RAJUVAS functional at CVAS, Bikaner, Navania (Udaipur) and PGIVER, Jaipur. Each Unit has one Programme Officer and 100 volunteers. These units are administratively controlled by one Programme Coordinator at university level. Dean Students Welfare generally works as the Programme Coordinator for the University.
