Minutes of the Second Meeting of the Extension Education Council held on 17th July, 2015

The second meeting of Extension Education Council of RAJUVAS was held on 17th July 2015 at 11.00 AM in the meeting hall of Vice-Chancellor Secretariat, RAJUVAS, Bikaner under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot. List of participants is provided in Annexure I.

At the outset, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot welcomed all the worthy members of the Extension Education Council of the Rajasthan University of Veterinary & Animal Sciences, Bikaner and introduced the External Members particularly, Prof. G.N. Mathur, CSH, KVK, Ajmer, Dr. Umesh Agarwal, OSD to VC, Jaipur, Sh. Sudesh Choudhary, Progressive farmer & Chairman, Gangmul Dairy and Sh. Narendra Singh Tanwar, Progressive farmer. Director Extension Education informed the house about the agenda to be considered in the meeting and requested Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor to initiate the proceedings of the meeting. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor in his opening remarks emphasized that the faculty of veterinary and animal science in the university is spread all over Rajasthan and now has got capabilities to meet out the extension needs in the State. Subsequently, the agenda of the meeting were taken one by one.

Brief introduction of the activities of the University by Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor

At the outset, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Professor A.K. Gahlot gave brief introduction of different activities of RAJUVAS, Bikaner in progress and future planning. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor stressed about the importance of extension activities of RAJUVAS and especially of VUTRCs whose responsibilities are more and needs strengthening, however it is delayed due to lack of land allotment to many VUTRC's. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor told that income from animal husbandry sector contributes more than 50% in agriculture sector in the State and we should work for the upliftment of poor livestock owners. He had directed the Officer Incharges of the VUTRCs that local leaders and district administration should be well



and achievements of RAJUVAS. Officer Incharges should prepare a database of training for accountability of trainings and especially weaker sections should be involved more in the trainings for their skill development. All the LRS's and institutions of RAJUVAS should act as VUTRC's and disseminate the technology generated to the farmers of the state. VUTRC's should be strengthened in respect of equipments, manpower and internet for e-governance. He stressed that annual action plan for VUTRCs should be prepared well in advance and Incharges should be ready to prepare the action plan of VUTRC's by next January, 2016 like ICAR pattern of KVK.

Discussion about co-ordination of Extension Education activities with other line departments in the State & Presentation of Annual Progress Report 2014-15 of Directorate of Extension Education

Director Extension Prof. R.K. Dhuria presented the Annual Progress Report of Directorate of Extension Education for the year 2014-15. The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor and Chairman of the committee was pleased with the progress made so far in the KVK and VUTRC's and emphasized the need for more hard work to establish trust and confidence with the line departments in general and the livestock owners/breeders of Rajasthan in particular.



Dr. Umesh Agarwal and Sh. Sudesh Choudhary external members suggested that VUTRC's and KVK should tie-up with local line departments and cooperative dairies, NGOs especially for imparting trainings. Prof. G.N. Mathur stressed for formation of Scientific Advisory Committee for each VUTRC on lines of KVK's.

Evaluation of the functioning of KVK and VUTRCs, Presentation of Annual Progress Report 2014-15 of KVK, Nohar, Presentation of Annual Progress Reports 2014-15 of VUTRCs & New Extension works to be taken up by KVK and VUTRC's

Respective unit Incharges in the following order presented the annual progress of KVK & VUTRC's:

- 1. KVK, Nohar (Hanumangarh): Dr Akshaya Ginthala, Teaching Associate presented the progress report of KVK, Nohar. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor suggested that while quoting success stories of farmers, role of KVK or VUTRC's should be highlighted and Dr. Umesh Agarwal suggested that status of farmer before & after the training, supply of the technical & other inputs by VUTRC's should also be described.
- 2. Veterinary University Training & Research Centre, Bakalia (Nagaur): Dr. Kamal Purohit, Assistant Professor & Incharge presented the progress report of Centre.
- 3. Veterinary University Training & Research Centre, Suratgarh (Sriganganagar): Dr. Ashok Bainda, Assistant Professor & Incharge presented the progress report of Centre. Incharge informed that construction of building is completed and centre has been shifted to new building. The remaining land from Municipal Corporation, Suratgarh through Joint Director, Animal Husabndry, Sriganganagar has also been procured. Officer Incharge, VUTRC, Suratgarh had specifically quoted that Sh. Sudesh Choudhary, Chairman, Gangmul Dairy was also invited as Chief Guest in one of the trainings organized by VUTRC with Gangmul Dairy.
- 4. Veterinary University Training & Research Centre, Kumher (Bharatpur): Dr. Subhash Chandra Yadav, Assistant Professor & Incharge presented the progress report of Centre. He informed the house that construction of building is completed and centre has been shifted to new building.
- 5. Veterinary University Training & Research Centre, Sirohi: Dr.Sudeep Solanki, Assistant Professor & Incharge presented the progress report of Centre. Land for Sirohi VUTRC has been procured from the Government and construction of building has been started. Incharge raised the issue of boundary wall along with construction of building. He was directed to submit the proposal accordingly.



- 6. Veterinary University Training & Research Centre, Churu: Dr. Rajesh Singathia, Assistant Professor & Incharge presented the progress report of Centre.
- 7. Veterinary University Training & Research Centre, Tonk: Dr. Nirmal Kumar Jeph, Assistant Professor & Incharge presented the progress report of Centre. Incharge informed that allocation of land is pending at the level of Govt. and ICAR, New Delhi.
- 8. Veterinary University Training & Research Centre, Dungarpur: Dr. Sudeep Solanki,
 Assistant Professor & Incharge presented the progress report of Centre.
- 9. Veterinary University Training & Research Centre, Kota: Dr. Atul Shankar Arora, Assistant Professor & Incharge presented the progress report of Centre. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor informed that University had demanded 50 Bigha land from Nanta Agriculture farm (CAD) and proposal has been submitted to the Government. Officer Incharge, VUTRC, Kota should be prepared for giving any information about the land requirement while the Hon'ble Chief Minister will be at Kota during Sarkar Apke Dwar programme in coming August-September, 2015.
- 10. Veterinary University Training & Research Centre, Chittorgarh: Dr. Manish Agarwal, Assistant Professor & Incharge presented the progress report of Centre. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor commented on the annual report of VUTRC, Chittorgarh and told that while taking collaboration from line departments & NGO's, it should be specified that the collaboration is financial, technical or human resource. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor had given the example of opening of a sub-centre at Village Bhadsoda with the help of Sanwalia Ji Temple Trust, where trust had given two halls and free supply of the medicines for the treatment of animals at the sub-centre. He urged Officer Incharges of other VUTRC's to explore the possibilities of having sub-centers with the help of NGOs.
- 11. Veterinary University Training & Research Centre, Ajmer: Dr. Roshan Lal Dav, Retd. Jt. Director & Incharge presented the progress report of Centre

Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor had directed the VUTRC's to have animal population from the recent animal census figures available up to village level. During the discussion, Hon'ble had informed about a constitution of Internal Environment Assessment Committee at University level, which will assess the five years progress of the RAJUVAS. The Committee may ask about any information of VUTRC that may be immediately supplied to the Committee by all the centers.



Regarding, new extension works to be taken up by KVKs and VUTRC's, the house suggested that following new extension work may be taken up by the University as soon as possible:

1. Constitution of Scientific Advisory Committee (SAC):

To assess, review and guide the programme and progress of VUTRC's, Dr. G.N. Mathur suggested constitution of Scientific Advisory Committee (SAC). The members of this Committee may comprises a cross section of scientific, farming community, representatives of both government and non-government organizations who are directly or indirectly involved in the process of animal husbandry training, production and development as constituted for KVK's. It was resolved to formulate such Scientific Advisory Committee (SAC) for VUTRC.

2. Training of Rural Youth as RAJUVAS Sakha/Sakhi:

It was resolved that one person (male/ female) who is reasonably educated and preferably young and unemployed from each panchayat will be given training for Animal Husbandry practices, first aid to the animals and artificial insemination. He/she will be known as RAJUVAS Sakha/Sakhi in the area. He/she will disseminate and use the training given to him for the welfare of animals and economic gain to the farmers. By this way, University should train about 10,000 young and uneducated rural persons as RAJUVAS Sakha in next five years, so that at least one Sakha/Sakhi may represent from every gram panchayat of the State.

3. Organization of State and District level "Pashu Vigyan Mela:

The University extension education service maintains live and intimate links with other lepartments and the field level functionaries of different line departments of the State, development agencies and farmers on the other hand. Further, to coordinate the Extension Education activities with other line departments in the State, it was resolved to organize a "Pashu Vigyan Mela" annually at each VUTRC's so that the animal owners of particular district can be given new technology at their own places and good producing animals of local breeds can be identified. A state level "Pashu Vigyan Mela" can also be organized at University Head Quarters so that the new technologies in the field of Veterinary and Animal Husbandry can be demonstrated and transferred to large number of farmers at one place.

4. Extensive Training programme of farmers:

It was resolved that the efforts can be made to increase the number of beneficiaries through line departments like Animal Husbandry, Agriculture, ATMA, NGO's. Health and infertility camps can be organized in collaboration with line department or NGO's.

Discussions about development of farmers' education, trainings and advisory services

A detailed discussion was held on this point in house. The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor suggested that DEE should handle SMS Service & Toll Free Helpline Service for the farmers. Toll free number should be attached to PBX & one operator can connect to expert of the University according to farmer's problem. Farmer's portal should be developed as suggested by Joint Secretary, National Livestock Mission. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor told that role of RAJUVAS should be as state player for Government of Rajasthan as far as veterinary and animal science matters are concerned. VUTRC's & KVK should form the database of farmers' mobile numbers & email address as far as available so that the published material can be disseminated to farmers in one shot.

Discussion about generation of extension materials, compilation of transferable

To bring out the desirable changes among the farmers to increase productivity from animals, involves both learning, and teaching which needs some tools or methods commonly known as extension-teaching methods. Presently a monthly Hindi publication of "Pashupalan Naye Aayam" is being undertaken by DEE and "Pashu Aahar Evum Chara Bulletin" by LFRMTC, Bikaner for farmers community. Looking to the need of the day, it was resolved to develop region-wise need based transferable technologies and leaflets by the VUTRC's, which will be transferred to the animal owners in on and off campus trainings or at farmers door. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor also suggested that the publication of the extension literature s ould be centralized with DEE. All the departmental heads and PI's of University Centers should support and provide necessary input to the DEE, RAJUVAS, Bikaner for preparation of such materials. All the published material can also be sent to panchayat samities or gram panchayats. It was also resolved that e-Kiosk should be established at every VUTRC's so that the farmers can get the desired information by touch screen handling.

At the end, while giving thanks for inviting in this meeting, Dr. G.N. Mathur suggested that VUTRC's can be strengthened by extension initiatives which includes collection, compilation and dissemination of livestock technologies like increase in feed and fodder production by Hydroponics and Azola farming, use of solar energy, Gobar Gas etc. Survey should be done for the purpose of real problem identification and participation in solving the problem. All the Officer Incharge of VUTRC's & KVK should have interphase



with line department's officers from Joint Directors to Veterinary Officers and Agriculture Extension Officers of their district. Every action of VUTRC's should be directed towards the increase in productivity per unit of animal. Prof. Mathur also suggested that every VUTRC may have a revolving fund. Sh. Sudesh Chaudhary, Progressive farmer & Chairman, Gangmul Dairy stressed that policy makers and political leaders need to be sensitized about the affairs of animals and its production. Animal Husbandry enterprises need to be made profitable otherwise now youth of the villages are distracting from animal keeping. Sh. Narendra Singh Tanwar proposed that State should import sexed semen and it was approved by house to send the recommendation to the proper forum of the State.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the chair.
