Minutes of the 3rd meeting of the Extension Education Council held on 5th February, 2017 at 11.00 AM in the Meeting Hall of VC Secretariat, RAJUVAS, Bikaner

The 3rd meeting of the Extension Education Council was held on 5th February, 2017 at 11.00 AM in the Meeting Hall of V.C. Secretariat, RAJUVAS, Bikaner under the Chairmanship of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot. The list of members as well as invitees present in the meeting has been enclosed as Annexure-1.

At the outset, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot welcomed all the worthy members of the Extension Education Council of the Rajasthan University of Veterinary & Animal Sciences, Bikaner and introduced the External Members particularly, Dr. G.N. Mathur, (Retd) Professor, and Additional Director (Ajmer), DEE, Bikaner, Dr. Umesh Agarwal, OSD to VC, Jaipur, Sh. Arvind Ohja, CEO, Urmul trust, Bikaner. Director Extension Education Prof. R.K. Dhuria informed the house about the agenda to be considered in the meeting and requested Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor to initiate the proceedings of the meeting. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor in his opening remarks emphasized that the faculty of Veterinary and Animal Science of the University is spread all over Rajasthan and now has got capabilities to meet out the extension needs in the State. Subsequently, the agenda of the meeting were taken one by one.

Brief introduction of the activities of the University by Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor

At the outset, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. (Dr.) Col. A.K. Gahlot extended warm welcome to all the members of the Council. While briefing the House about the achievements as well as its activities, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot pointed out that significant progress has been made by RAJUVAS in the entire sector i.e. Teaching, Research and Extension. The University has strengthened their extension activities by way of our presence in 17 out of 33 districts, which is more than 50% of total geographical area of the State. The extension activities are very important through which we can reach to the door step of the farmers. Also the extension activities are the tunnels of technology through which we promote our technology for farmers. In the State like Rajasthan, where traditional farming

concept is there, trainings provided through VUTRCs particularly skill development programmes incorporating our technologies, play an important role in this regard.

Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor also informed the house about recent visit of Hon'ble Chief Minister along with Hon'ble Sh. Dushyant Singh Ji, Member of Parliament at Livestock Research Station, Dug, Jhalawar on 16th of December, 2016 where she remained for around 1 hour 45 minutes and we could get not only the opportunity to show-case of Malvi Cattle Breeding Farm and its activities, but also, to apprise her our Animal Husbandry Diploma Programme started recently. The Hon'ble CM interacted with the students also. *Bhoomi Poojan* of AHDP Building was also undertaken by Hon'ble C.M. at our farm and she praised the RAJUVAS for its different activities. While discussion with the Hon'ble Chief Minister, it was pointed out by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor that we are successful to improve the milk yield of Malvi cows up to 7 liters per day. Hon'ble CM was surprised to know about low milk yield of Malvi cattle, it was explained by Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor that in the area where rainfall is very high and most of farmers' population is engaged in agriculture, they pay very little attention towards the productivity of animals; therefore, this breed was never improved. The average milk yield of Malvi breed is half to one kg per day and our target is to provide Malvi cow of 15 liters milk yield per day in this region. Using better management practices, balanced ration as well as keeping the health aspect in mind, we have raised its milk yield up to 7 kg/day.

The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor pointed out that only teaching and research is not the motive of the University, we have to reach to farmers by providing skill development trainings and make aware them about the new technologies, its use, its benefit etc., so that they can earn more for better livelihood. Our emphasis should be first to teach the farmers and make them to learn the nutritional, health and managerial aspects for their animals and to transfer the technologies by using all possible means of communications viz., skill development trainings, radio programme, SMS Advisory services, publications, farmers' interaction and through field visits. To meet out the target of the State Government i.e. to double the milk production in next five years and to double the income of the farmers by 2020 as per Central Government, the Directorate of Extension Education should prepare a plan to increase the number of Extension activities and set the target to train about 350000 livestock owners in next financial year. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor also pointed out that DEE should prepare a database of training for accountability of trainings and Officer Incharges of



all VUTRC should develop a database by making a group of 100 progressive livestock owners in each district.

After the guiding remarks of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, agenda items were discussed and resolved as follows:

2. Director Research, RAJUVAS, Bikaner - Member
3. Dr. Umesh Agarwal, OSD to VC, RAJUVAS, Jaipur - Member
4. Director Extension Education, RAJUVAS, Bikaner - Member Secretary

The sanction for constitution of committee shall be taken by DEE on file.

(ii) Regarding action taken report of agenda No. EEC 02/E1, it was resolved to add a representative from NABARD bank of the district and a representative from each of the NGOs working in the district in the field of Animal Husbandry as Ex- officio member of Scientific Advisory Committee for each VUTRC.

(iii) Regarding action taken report of agenda No. EEC 02/E2, the proposal submitted by DEE for RAJUVAS Sakha & Sakhi was again discussed at length and it was resolved to modify the proposals with following point.

- The age limit may be modified from previously proposed 25-30 years to age of above 18 years for RAJUVAS Sakha-Sakhi.

It was also resolved that this proposal may be sent to Government under RKVY or National Livestock Mission for providing the budget. Meanwhile, University should start some Pilot projects for RAJUVAS Sakha-Sakhi at Bikaner, Nagaur and Dholpur districts with the help of some NGOs. Dr. Umesh Agarwal, OSD to VC, RAJUVAS, Jaipur suggested that URMUL

Trust, Bikaner, Urmul Khejri, Nagaur and Manjari Foundation or Pradan, Dholpur working in the field of Animal Husbandry can cooperate in this project with RAJUVAS. It was decided that DEE along with Dr. Umesh Agarwal, OSD to VC, RAJUVAS, Jaipur may explore the possibility to start this prime project with NGOs.

Presentation of Annual Progress Report 2015-16 of Directorate of Extension Education

Director Extension Prof. R.K. Dhuria presented the Annual Progress Report of Directorate of Extension Education for the year 2015-16. The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor and Chairman of the Council was pleased with the progress made so far in the DEE, KVK and VUTRCs and emphasized the need for more hard work to establish trust and confidence with the line departments in general and the livestock owners/breeders of Rajasthan in particular.

Prof. G.N. Mathur, (Retd) Professor, and Additional Director (Ajmer), DEE, Bikaner stressed to revise the survey proforma and to include the production data of animals, so that some input about productivity of animals will come out. Dr. Umesh Agarwal, OSD to VC, RAJUVAS, Jaipur and Sh. Arvind Ohja, CEO, Urmul Trust, Bikaner suggested that VUTRCs should tie-up with local line departments and cooperative dairies, NGOs and KVK especially for imparting trainings. Dr. G.N. Mathur also suggested that district administration shall include the VUTRCs in future planning of the development programs in district specially related to Animal Husbandry. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor suggested that University will do the efforts to pursue the Government to write a letter to District Administration to include the VUTRCs in the planning meetings for development of Animal Husbandry especially at district level.

Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor commented on the overall progress report of all VUTRCs & KVK and directed to undertake the Impact Study of Trainings and accordingly need based training programme should be planned. The house was of the opinion that in the end of the training, a feedback from each trainee farmer may be obtained for further improvement. Further, Sh. Arvind Ohja, CEO, Urmul trust, Bikaner suggested to take the cooperation of NGOs working in a particular district for widening the activities of VUTRC. Prof. A.K. Kataria, Incharge Apex Center, CVAS, Bikaner pointed out that in Animal Treatment Camps conducted by VUTRC, only number of farmers benefitted were taken in consideration, it was suggested that number of animals benefitted may be mentioned in the reports. Dr. Kataria also suggested to organize a workshop for staff of VUTRCs as master trainers in terms of disease monitoring and surveillance for improvement in future trainings and he is ready to organize this workshop at Apex Center, CVAS, Bikaner.

Discussion about Proposal for Community Radio Stations (CRS) at RAJUVAS, Bikaner

It was resolved that an immediate action may be taken by DEE for establishing the Community Radio Centre as Ministry also emphasize that spectrum is a scarce resource and only 3 bands are allotted for Community Radio in a certain area for setting up of CR station. The house agreed unanimously for setting up Community Radio Station at RAJUVAS campus Bikaner and utilizes this most potent communication medium supported by Government of India. It was resolved that all the required correspondence may be initiated with Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, New Delhi for establishment of the above centre including obtaining of budget by DEE. As mentioned in the letter No D.O. 803/114/2016-CRS dated 5th January, 2017 received from Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, New Delhi, the remaining amount of approximately Rs. 2.5 lacs will be borne by the University. A proposal of allocation of budget of remaining amount will be submitted by DEE to Comptroller for sanction.

Establishment of "Centre of Excellence in Fisheries" at VUTRC, Suratgarh

It was resolved that the Centre of Excellence in fisheries may be established at VUTRC Suratgarh. The required budget of Rs. 7.00 lacs shall be provided by the University from UDF. The fingerlings for producing fishes shall be provided by CVAS Navania.

Proposal for new AHDP institute at Suratgarh and Nagaur

It was resolved that the AHDP Institutes may be established at VUTRCs of Suratgarh & Nagaur. It was principally agreed and decided to start with the availability of the full staff and other facilities at these VUTRCs.

Need of separate new building of DEE and Farmers Hostel at three University campuses and at each VUTRCs

It was resolved that the construction of the new building of DEE may be undertaken immediately. The estimate presented by DEE in the agenda and prepared by Director Works (EO) shall be sanctioned from UDF.

The house also resolved that construction of farmer's hostel is of urgent need because year round extension activities like trainings is going on. It was agreed principally. The house authorized the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor for providing the budget for construction of the

farmer's hostel from State Plan & RKVY allocations with the assistance of DEE and Comptroller. It was decided to build the farmers hostel on the first story of the present newly build VUTRCs because the foundation is strong enough to sustain the first story and it will cut short the construction cost also.

Requirement of 20+D seats Bus Vehicle for Exhibition

It was resolved that looking towards the urgent need of 20+ D seats Bus Vehicle for Exhibition, the budget of Rs 11.00 lacs shall be provided from UDF.

Planning of Expenditure in different Budget Heads of VUTRC

The house authorized the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor with the assistance of DEE and Comptroller to finalize the utilization of the budget received under different heads of RKVY & State Plan for different VUTRCs establishments.

Staying facilities to the farmers coming for trainings in the University Guest House/Faculty House

It was resolved that the farmers coming for trainings conducted by RAJUVAS may be charged as Rs 50/- for non A/C Rooms and Rs 100 for AC Rooms in the Guest House/Faculty House. In case of no provision of budget for staying of the farmers in the trainings, specific permission may be taken from Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor for free staying in each case.

Increase the number of copies of publication of monthly "Pashupalan Naye Ayam" from 3000 to 5000

It was discussed at length and house was of the opinion that the copy of "Pashu Palan Naye Ayam" may be sent to each panchayat of the State. It was resolved that at present the district where VUTRCs are functional may be covered and the publication may be increased in phased manner. Presently publication may be increased from 3000 to 5000 copies looking towards the facilities available in DEE.

It was approved and DEE was directed to give the detailed budget for approval to Comptroller under UDF budget head.

The house in principal agreed for construction of boundary wall at VUTRC, Sirohi, Jhunjhunu, Dholpur, Ratangarh and Suratgarh and Repair & Renovation of Existing structure of VUTRC, Suratgarh. It was resolved to authorize the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor with the assistance of DEE and Comptroller to finalize the utilization of the budget received under different heads of RKVY & State Plan.

Any other item with the permission of the Chair

A power point presentation was given by Mr. Taher Sarthalwala, Project Manager, Reliance Foundation Information Services, Mumbai with the permission of Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor to extend the advisory services to RAJUVAS target audiences with and various need based expert institutions support.

Mr. Taher Sarthwala, Project Manager, Reliance Foundation Information Services reported that Reliance Foundation is a philanthropic arm of Reliance Industries Limited and one of the programme in Reliance Foundation is called "Information Services" (RFIS) operational since 2013. The programme is providing need based localized information / advisories to farmers, marine fisher folk, livestock owners, inland fisher folk, micro-entrepreneurs, rural youth and their family members by organizing interactions, interactive discussions / trainings in the areas of agriculture, fisheries, livestock, health, education, early warning, government schemes, insurance, etc. in their local language using multiple communication modes with the support of more than 450 government / universities / research institutions / hospitals / banks and other organizations. Reliance Foundation Information Services (RFIS) programme is reaching may be interpreted as potential individuals using RFIS are spread over 16,000 villages across the 9 states - Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, Kerala, Odisha, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal and Karnataka through cable TV, Radio, Print Media, field based services, medical / livestock / plant disease diagnostic and advisories camps. Now the programme would like to expand the services in Rajasthan. In this background, Reliance Foundation Information Services would like to extend the advisories services to RAJUVAS network target audiences with and various need based expert institutions support.

After presentation and discussion, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor suggested that Reliance Foundation Information Services shall submit the sound proposal for SMS advisory Service, Voice Massage Service and Multi-location Audio-Video Conference with no financial liability on part of the University.

The Chairman also invited the Officers and members if they have any specific comments or suggestion for betterment of extension work being undertaken as well as any future plan. Dr. S.K. Kashyap, Dean, PGS complimented the efforts of staff of VUTRCs.

The Member Secretary thanked Chairman for review of extension work and providing valuable suggestion/input to each Officer Incharge and Teaching Associate of VUTRCs. The Member Secretary also thanked member Extension Education Council, Government nominee, Comptroller and invitees for sparing precious time and attending the meeting whole day. The Member Secretary also thanked all the staff members for their hard work for making the deliberations successful.
