

RAJUVAS Ranked in 100 TOP Universities of India

Under the dynamic leadership, the visionary approach and the boost provided by Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot RAJUVAS has showed its strength in all aspects and at national level also. The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF), Ministry of Human Resources Development, Govt. of India, New Delhi has declared the ranking of Universities in India and RAJUVAS got following in this:

- RAJUVAS is third amongst the Veterinary Universities of the country.
- RAJUVAS is second amongst the all state Universities in Rajasthan.
- In Teaching, Learning & Resources (TLR) parameter RAJUVAS is 6th in India amongst all the Universities.

Overall, RAJUVAS is ranked 97 out of 744 universities in India, which is the youngest University among all. The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) outlines a methodology to rank institutions across the country with parameters broadly cover "Teaching, Learning and Resources," "Research and Professional Practices," "Graduation Outcomes," "Outreach and Inclusivity," and "Perception". Evaluation of Goat Farming Based Livelihood Programme of CmF by RAJUVAS

The Centre for Microfinance project of economic upliftment of goat farmers of western Rajasthan will be evaluated by the RAJUVAS. What's New?

Operation Theater for Ophthalmic Surgery in Animals

An advance operation theater for small animal eye surgery was inaugurated on 30th May, 2016 by Sh. Shambhu Dayal Badgujar, Chairman, Rajasthan Khadi and Gram Udhyog. He visited TVCC and appreciated the work done. Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot informed about the facilities developed by RAJUVAS for ophthalmic surgery (Phaco Surgery) in animals. These advanced techniques are at par with those used for human eye surgery. Dr. Praveen Bishnoi, Head Department of Surgery and Dr. Suresh Jhirwal, Incharge Eye Surgery, Dean- Directors and other faculty members were present on this occasion.



Mobile App for Calculation of the Doses of Medicines

Dr. Hemant Joshi, Assistant Professor, Department of Veterinary Anatomy, CVAS, Navania, developed a Mobile App for calculation of the doses of medicines given to the wild animals for the treatment. This app calculates the dose of medicine very accurately on the basis of algometric scaling.

Buck Semen Cryopreservation and AI in Sirohi Goat

Semen collection, cryopreservation and artificial insemination in Sirohi goat is first time started at CVAS, Navania. The elite buck semen is collected by using Artificial Vagina while keeping estrus doe in the travis as a dummy. Normally, 0.7 to 1.0 ml semen is collected in the AV and examined for the mass motility, sperm concentration and progressive motility. The sample having mass motility of grade +4 and progressive motility more than 80% is further processed for the cryopreservation by conventional method. Artificial Insemination of the doe in heat is performed by the Trans-Cervical method. The insemination of the goat with frozen semen would be useful not only for commercial breeders interested for genetic improvement of their stock, but also for small producer who cannot afford a breeding buck of their own. Dr.



R.K. Nagda, PI of AICRP on Sirohi Goat and Dr. C.S. Saraswat initiated this work in Sirohi goat.

Increase of Stipend for PG & Ph. D Students
