

What's New

Inclusion of RAJUVAS in NAHEP Component-2 of ICAR

RAJUVAS, Bikaner has been included in National Agricultural Higher Education Project (NAHEP) Component-2 project by ICAR, New Delhi. One Virtual Classroom has been setup at Bikaner campus under this project through which students can connect anywhere anytime with the faculty members through online mode. These lectures will be recorded also on ICAR server and will be available for veterinary students spread over the country in different universities. Total 18 Universities has been selected for this project in country and RAJUVAS is one of them.

← E-Certificate Courses under CVE Programme

RAJUVAS has started four online e-courses under continuing veterinary education programme for the field veterinarians to make them aware about the latest techniques and to revise subject knowledge.
