From Vice-Chancellor's Desk

Hello! Fellow colleagues, I am happy to mention that both state and union budgets had special concerns about agriculture and animal husbandry sectors. Hon'ble Chief Minister, Smt. Vasundhara Raje in State budget presented recently, has announced the expansion of advanced and modern veterinary facilities for the animals. Hon'ble CM has mentioned in her budget announcement that high technology and advanced treatment services of RAJUVAS will be available directly

to the state's veterinarians and general animal owners through Tele-Medicine. To give this benefit to the animal owners, the state-wide multispeciality clinics located at all seven divisional headquarters will be connected through Tele-medicine. Likewise, Hon'ble Prime Minister, Sh. Narendra Modi presented a good budget for the financial year 2017-18. The Government aims to double the income of the farmers in the next five years. For this, the government has made massive financial provisions for flagship schemes such as crop insurance, irrigation, health card and dairy development. Provision of 10 lac crores has been kept for agricultural credit to marginal and small farmers, 20 thousand crores for irrigation schemes, 8 thousand crores for dairy development and five thousand crores for micro irrigation has been allocated in the budget. These provisions will increase the purchasing capacity of the farmers and they will be motivated for better production in agriculture and animal husbandry. RAJUVAS is also paying its active part in doubling the income of farmers by setting up new dimensions in the field of education, research and extension. The farmers and livestock owners of the state are getting the direct benefits of different new techniques and innovations developed by the University i.e. 24X7 Toll-free helpline service, Dhine Ri Bataya Radio programme etc.

The university is not limiting itself to the field of animal husbandry growth but also cultural growth. An 'Art Club' has also been set up to promote, creation of scientific and tech-based short films for students and academicians of the RAJUVAS. Recently "Agri-Unifest 2017" was also successfully organized by RAJUVAS from 22-25 February, 2017, which is a matter of pride for us. Let's come, we will ensure our participation in the advancement and A-14:0 development of the country. (A. K. Gahlot)

Increase in Internship Allowance

Meeting of Board of Studies

The proposal to implement new courses on cyber-crime by the next session of the first year was passed. Board also approved the MSVE offered by the VCI for Veterinary and Animal Science Bachelor Curriculum. The new norms and rules of affiliation of institution for the two-year AHDP were approved by the Board. All the Deans of constituents' colleges and Head of Departments attended this meeting.

10th Academic Council Meeting

10th meeting of Academic Council of RAJUVAS was held on 4th February, 2017 under the Chairmanship of Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot. To make students aware about digital India, digital cash payments and increasing academic activities on mobile, the "cyber-crime" curriculum will be implemented in the first year of veterinary education. The academic council also approved the proposal to provide the Governor Gold Medal each year to a student securing first position in the post-graduate examination in the university. The academic council also approved new private AHDP Institutes in Alwar and Bundi districts. Sh. B.R. Meena, Registrar as Member Secretary organized this meeting.

Meeting of Extension Education Council

Third meeting of the Extension Education Council was held on 5th February, 2017 under the Chairmanship of Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot. It was decided in the meeting that Community Radio Services will be started in Bikaner and by this, the livestock owners in the radius of 10-15 Km will be benefitted. In order to promote fish farming in the state, Centre of Excellence in Fisheries will be established at VUTRC, Suratgarh. Vice-Chancellor informed that in the next financial year, training for skill development related to animal husbandry will be organized for thirty five thousand farmers. In the meeting, the annual progress report for the year 2015-16 was presented by Prof. R.K. Dhuria, Director Extension Education. Power point presentations were given on progress made by the Officers Incharges of 12 VUTRCs and one KVK of the University.

Meeting of Research Council

Third meeting of the University Research Council was held on 6th February, 2017 headed by Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot. It was decided that University will formulate its own strategy on the impact of climate change on the animals by setting up weather information centres in its eight Livestock Research Stations. Six research projects of LRS's have been approved by the University from its revolving fund. In the meeting, PI of all research projects running under RKVY, ICAR and World Bank submitted their progress reports and action plans for next year. Director Research Prof. Rakesh Rao was Organizing Secretary of this meeting.
