From Vice-Chancellor's Desk

Indigenous cows are a boon for us. Rajasthan is the first State in the country, where most of the indigenous cows give us 90% of the milk. Promotion and development activities of the country's indigenous cows are being extended ahead on priority because they have the ability to produce good quality milk by simple and cheaper management practices. Due to this supremacy, the rearing of our indigenous cattle is also increasing in foreign countries. In countries like Brazil, the Gir breed is being overwhelmingly

abundant from which up to 60 litres of milk is being yielded. Demand of indigenous cows of the Rajasthan is continuously increasing in the other states of the country also. Some progressive cattle keepers in Pune have established the Tharparkar Cow Club with the technical guidance of RAJUVAS. Two NGOs in Karnataka State got inspiration from RAJUVAS and have initiated the setting up of Kankarej Govansh Kendra. RAJUVAS has produced 26 litres of milk per day from the indigenous cattle maintained at its Livestock Research Centres just by scientific management, proper health care and balanced feeding practices. This success has been achieved without medication,

hormones, or genetic changes. The University scientists have done augmentation of indigenous cattle in three areas according to the needs of the cattle breeders. Increasing milk production, reducing the gap between two conceptions and efforts to reduce the age of first calving has got anticipated success. The age of first calving of 5 to 6 years in Kankarej has been brought to two and a half years. By establishing the Kamdhanu Shodhpeeth at the University by the State Government, the scientific efforts will be made to make the indigenous cows more useful using modern technologies. The advanced breeding techniques and in vitro fertilization will be given priority. Along with all these, the research work will be done in Ayurveda like Panchgavya, quality of indigenous cow milk and standardization of cow urine. Our Indigenous cows are our most precious heritage. RAJUVAS has also provided free cattle calves to the Gaushala and progressive cattle breeders of State for the promotion of the indigenous cattle, which will promote the utility and popularity of the indigenous cattle in the country. It is an attempt of RAJUVAS that, the 'Gaushalas' of the State become the centre of Indigenous Cattle Conservation. (A. K. Gahlot)
