Prof. Vishnu Sharma took over the charge on 9th August, 2018. Prof. Sharma completed his B.V.Sc & A.H., M.V.Sc and Ph.D from Rajasthan Agricultural University, Bikaner. Prof. Sharma also obtained International Diploma in Animal Feed Training Programme, from IPC, Livestock College, Netherland (1998) and Diploma in French from A/f, Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. Prof. Sharma worked for more than 6 years as Dean of Post Graduate Institute of Veterinary Education and Research, Jaipur. He has several credits to him viz., Fellowship from Netherlands Govt. for Sustainable Livestock Production in Philippines, Fellow award of National Academy of Veterinary Sciences and Compound Livestock Feed Manufacturers Association (CLFMA) Award, Prof. Sharma as eminent scientist has visited several countries of Europe, U.S.A, Brazil, Ethiopia, Philippines and Malaysia. All the faculty members, non-teaching staff and students of the University welcomed Prof. Vishnu Sharma as a new Vice-Chancellor of RAJUVAS.





From Vice-Chancellor's Desk

Dear Readers,

I am feeling immense pleasure to present the new issue of RAJUVAS Newsletter of the year 2018 after joining as Vice-Chancellor of this fast growing University of the country. The first and only Veterinary University of the Rajasthan State has established a number of records in the field of veterinary education, research and extension education in eight years of its establishment and has made a special identity in the country. In the past years, many useful educational, research and extension programmes and schemes were implemented in order to provide advanced technology and knowledge to the veterinarians along with teaching, research and extension. Now the responsibility of taking the University from childhood to maturity is on our shoulders. In the last eight years, the budget of the university has increased from about Rs. 14 crore to Rs. 140 crore. By developing a culture of work, together with all the efforts, discipline and abstinence of all of us, will take the RAJUVAS to the new heights. There is a need of conscious effort from all of us for developing the quality and effective education in diploma, bachelor and masters programmes. We have to show our readiness to prepare our future generation by paying our debt to the University. Quality research work considering farmers need, will be encouraged in eight Livestock Research Stations and Institutional level research projects located in the state. With the aim of accelerating breed improvement under the reform measures of six selected cattle Rathi, Tharparkar, Kankrej, Gir, Sahiwal and Malvi breeds of the state for the promotion of indigenous cattle, the University started the embryo transplantation work with the help of National Dairy Development Board. The first embryo transfer in Tharparkar cow has been successfully achieved by embryo transplantation technique. Scientists of RAJUVAS have obtained two female calves and one male calf of Tharparkar breed by transplanting the embryo from this breed in the Kankrej cow. I extend my heartiest congratulation to scientist involved in this big task. The University is also providing better 24x7 emergency clinical services to the livestock owners at its Veterinary Clinical Complex established in all the three constituents colleges of the University at Bikaner, Jaipur and Udaipur. RAJUVAS is also making steady efforts to reach to the end users i.e. farmers and livestock owners for sustainable animal production through 13 VUTRC's located in different districts of Rajasthan.

In the end, I am sure that the University is committed to its mandate, objectives and vision to deliver its best for the holistic development of animal husbandry sector in country in general and Rajasthan in particular.
