

From Vice-Chancellor's Desk

It is my immense pleasure to put before you the 2nd issue of RAJUVAS Newsletter. With this issue, we have entered into year 2011 and I am sure that this year will be a happy and prosperous year for the State as well as the Country. This year has been announced as World Veterinary Year during which throughout the world, the society will be made aware of the services being provided by veterinary professionals. It is needless to mention that this Veterinary University has also an important responsibility towards the society to serve in the best possible manner.

Since inception, the University is progressing leaps and bounds so that in the initial years of its establishment it can stand on firm footings. In this endeavour, the University has already added two veterinary colleges, two institutes of Diploma in Animal Husbandry and one institute for providing Post-graduate Education. The University has also acquired a development project from the Ministry of Textiles in the area of wool development. Similarly, two projects have been acquired in the field of Animal Nutrition under RKVY. One project for development of human resource in southern Rajasthan has also been obtained by the University. The University initiated the programmes of World Veterinary Year 2011 through a brain storming session on 24th January, 2011, the date on which the first veterinary school of the world was started at Lyon in France some 250 years back. As per the commitment of the University to involve itself in organizing scientific and public interest events, the University organized a "Patent Awareness Workshop" with the State Department of Science & Technology, Government of Rajasthan and a seminar on Social Uses of Atomic Energy in collaboration with the Rashtriya Hindi Vigyan Sahitiya Parishad of Bhabha Atomic Research Centre, Mumbai. The highlight of the seminar was

that on a very advanced topic of nuclear energy, the seminar was organized in Hindi which attracted the students, faculties from other colleges of Bikaner as well as press & media. In order to promote awareness about pet dog health and management, a "Dog Show" was also organized. The University has also started brain storming session on 12th Five-Year Plan Formulation. The initiation of this was done



by inviting Prof. K.M.L. Pathak, DDG (Animal Science), ICAR, New Delhi on 9th March, 2011 to sensitize and guide the faculty of the University towards emerging issues to be addressed during 12th Five-Year Plan formulation. The University has also started taking care of the welfare of faculty, staff and students for which several initiatives have been taken; amongst the salient one is re-designation of 30 Assistant Professors (Selection Grade) as Associate Professor in accordance with the directives of the Government of Rajasthan.

The faculty, staff and students join me towards our commitment to work for taking the University to new heights. I am sure, the University shall not leave any stone unturned towards achieving its objectives.

World Veterinary Year 🛛 🦷

The world's first veterinary School was founded in Lyon, France, in 1761, shortly followed by the Alfort Veterinary School, near Paris, in 1764, both on Claude Bourgelat's initiative. This means that 2011 will mark the 250th world anniversary of veterinary training. By setting up the world's first veterinary training institution, Bourgelat created the veterinary profession itself. 2011 will mark the 250th world anniversary of the veterinary profession. Bourgelat's genius did not stop there. As a result of his fruitful collaboration with surgeons in Lyon, he was also the first scientist who dared to suggest that studying animal biology and pathology would help to improve our understanding of human biology and pathology. 2011 will also mark the 250th anniversary of the concept of comparative biopathology without which modern medicine would never have emerged. So, it is thus much more than the creation of veterinary training that we should be celebrating in France in 2011. The entire world should be celebrating our veterinary profession, which has been working to improve both animal and human health for 250 years.

In 2011, all the veterinary institutions that will join World Veterinary Year will have to organize in their own countries events to promote our profession. This year, all international veterinary institutions, each in its special field, will dedicate themselves to promoting, during their annual event, a session celebrating the birth of veterinary profession, while at the same reminding opinion leaders and policymakers everywhere in the world that veterinarians have been serving mankind for 250 years. It is worth highlighting that veterinary professionals play contributory roles in animal and human health, food quality and safety, food security, ethology and psychology, biomedical research, wildlife conservation, ecology, and the protection of the environment and biodiversity. By preventing, detecting and controlling the (transboundary) animal diseases at source which is a Global Public Good, veterinarians contribute to the achievement of the millennium development goals. So, this year we are celebrating the veterinary profession, which has been working to improve both animal and human health for a quarter of a millennium.

The main aim is to improve public awareness and remind policymakers everywhere in the world that:

Our profession has been serving mankind for 250 years.

Modern veterinarians are not only animal doctors and animal welfare advocates, they are also key public health stakeholders because of their crucial role in promoting food security by supervising animal production hygiene, controlling zoonoses, monitoring food quality and safety, biomedical research, protecting the environment and biodiversity.

Gahlot highlighted that financial status of the University is now improving as compared to the initial stage when this University had been established as evidenced by different agencies of Central and State Governments, and NGOs are giving research projects and financial support to the University. Faculty chairman & Dean Prof. S.B.S. Yadav informed that all



the research projects are now being implemented satisfactorily and smoothly. ICAR is requested to support the new University by giving more research projects.

Research Achievements

Gir Cattle Breeding Farm, Started under RKVY at LRS, Navania

Gir cattle breeding farm funded under Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) was initiated at LRS, Navania. Dr. C.S. Vaishnava was appointed as PI of this project. The foundation stock of 31 lactating Gir cattle along with their followers was procured from native tract of Gir cattle in Kathiawar district of Gujrat. The civil works of building and semen station is also in progress.

Sheep & Wool Improvement Scheme

A total of 1,97,149 (One lac ninety seven thousand one hundred forty nine) Bikaneri-Chokhla sheep have been surveyed and registered under "Sheep & Wool Improvement Scheme" (SWIS) up to 31st March, 2011. This project of Rs.169.50 lacs was sanctioned to the RAJUVAS by Central Wool Developments Board, Ministry of Textiles, Government of India, Jodhpur. This project included establishment of two ram raising centers and multi facility center, distribution of rams and health coverage including vaccination of registered animals. A total of more than 380 sheep (Lambs/hoggets/rams/ewes) have been purchased. The young male lambs will be raised up to adult age and then these will be distributed amongst the registered breeders. The females will be used as mothers and raised for seed production.

Training organized

Training on "Personal Hygiene, Slaughtering & Slaughter House Management"

A one day training programme on "Personal Hygiene, Slaughtering & Slaughter House Management" was organized by National Meat and Poultry Processing Board, Ministry of Food Processing Industries, Govt. of India (MOFPI) and College of Veterinary and Animal Science, Bikaner at hotel Rajvilas on February 18, 2011. At this occasion Prof. S.B.S. Yadav, Faculty Chairman and Dean, College of Veterinary and Animal Science, Bikaner was the Chief Guest and other dignitaries of the city were also invited. The main objective of the workshop was to educate the local butchers and meat handlers regarding safe and hygienic practices during slaughter of animal, preservation of meat, slaughter house management and how post-mortem and ante-mortem is conducted. Tanwar stressed on zoonotic diseases in meat handlers & consumers, their prevention and control. Dr. R.N. Kachwaha illustrated different methods of meat preservation. Dr. Ravi Choudhary emphasized on methods of slaughter and Dr. Rajni Joshi delivered lecture on slaughter house management, antemortem and post-mortem examination and local zoonotic diseases. Local butchers & meat handlers gained knowledge through this training and appreciates the efforts of MOFPI.

Post-graduate programme started at Jaipur center of RAJUVAS

The post-graduate (M.V.Sc.) programme was started at Jaipur center of RAJUVAS for the session 2011-12. Consequently, centre was renamed as "Post Graduate Education and Research Centre for Livestock Health & Production" (PGE-RCLHP) Jaipur. Post-graduate programme was initiated in three disciplines viz., Animal Nutrition, Veterinary Microbiology and Livestock Production & Management with two seats in each department. Six students were admitted in the first batch and course programme commenced from February, 2011 with creation of respective departments at the centre.

Impact of Clinical Services of RAJUVAS -Animals brought from other Districts

A continuous development of clinical facilities in the Clinics of Veterinary Surgery and Radiology has its far reaching impact in various districts of Rajasthan. During last three months, eight horses were brought from Jodhpur, Jhunjhunu, Sriganganagar, Jaisalmer and Nagore districts for treatment of various surgical disorders. Dogs were brought in from Beawer for the treatment of ear hematoma, Jodhpur for venereal granuloma, Sriganganagar for anal gland impaction and Kota for cataract surgery. Camels of Border Security Force were brought in for treatment of mandibular fracture and other surgical affections from Jaisalmer, Barmer, Sriganganagar districts. The small animal owners were allowed their stay in the college guest house with their pets and those of large animal owners stayed in the farmers dormitory free of charge. These animals were provided free services and medicines which were available in the department stock. All animals were discharged after satisfactory recovery from the surgeries being done. Owners of these animals expressed thanks to the dedicated vets of this department for their esteemed services.

Students Placement Cell Established

To create and enhance the career opportunities to veterinary graduates and post-graduates, Students Placement Cell was established by RAJUVAS. This cell will maintain a computerized database of veterinary graduates and postgraduates. With the help of this database, the cell sponsors list of students to the recruiting agencies for employment opportunities. Dr. R.N. Kachwaha, as Chief Placement Officer and Dr. R.K. Dhuria, as Associate Placement Officer will discharge their duties related to this cell. A software company was given the assignment to develop the software for this purpose.

Hi Tech University

Gigabit Campus

The book has 92 manuscripts in 9 sections, e.g. radiographic anatomy, anatomy of various systems and common integument. These manuscripts were published by 158 authors working in 37 laboratories or colleges or institution from 14 countries in the Journal of Camel Practice and Research from 1994 to 2010. Dr. T.K. Gahlot Head, Department of Veterinary Surgery and Radiology deserves kudos for this academic venture alongwith other editors.
