

I am glad to present the new issue of "RAJUVAS Newsletter" with the firm belief that RAJUVAS will continuously work for the welfare of the students, animal owners and farmers.

Many new institutes, facilities and works have been started like establishing a new LRS, VUTRC and an NMPS project on Sirohi Goats at Chittorgarh, making 10 VUTRCs functional, Critical Care Unit (CCU) for animals at CVAS, Bikaner, new infrastructure of Sahiwal cattle breeding farm at LRS, Kodamdesar and establishing a Vaccinology and Biological Products Centre at CVAS, Bikaner. Under the Heritage Gene Bank Concept, around 100 Goshalas will now work with RAJUVAS for conservation and improvement of five Indigenous Cattle Breeds (Rathi, Tharparkar, Kankrej, Gir and Sahiwal) in the State.

The success of an SAU depends, not only, on the education and/or research components, but also, on efficient extension education system. RAJUVAS is making steady efforts to reach to the end user so that the technologies developed for sustainable animal production reach well in time to the farmers. In these efforts, RAJUVAS has made 10 Veterinary University Training & Research Centers (VUTRCs) at Ladnun (Nagaur), Suratgarh (Sriganganagar), Kumher (Bharatpur), Chittorgarh, Tonk, Dungarpur, Sirohi, Kota, Ajmer and Churu. These centers are providing regular training as well as diagnostic & research facilities to the livestock farmers. Apex centers for animal disease diagnosis, monitoring and surveillance (at Bikaner and Jaipur) of the University are also providing training to veterinary officers & livestock assistants to upgrade their skill & knowledge. So far RAJUVAS has provided animal disease control training to around half of the force of Vets and Paravets of the State.

RAJUVAS is formulating a policy of training of 10,000 young farmers from all over Rajasthan to make them representatives of RAJUVAS (RAJUVAS Sakha and RAJUVAS Sakhi) at each of the Panchayat of the State in next Five Years. These will be attached with VUTRCs and/or campuses situated in different districts of the State. University is also planning to start community radio in near future which will be run by the students under supervision of the experts of the University to provide information and knowledge to the livestock farmers. University is publishing monthly Hindi bulletin Pashu Palan Naye Ayam and a quarterly Pashu Aahar Evam Chara Bulletin. A unique RAJUVAS sponsored radio programme Dheene Ri Batyan for livestock farmers is being broadcasted from 17 All India Radio stations of Rajasthan on Thursday of every week from 5:30 to 6:00 PM. Several new Centers on Livestock Feed Resource Management & Technology, Organic Animal Product Technology, Animal Biodiversity Conservation, Disaster Management Technology for Animals etc. are regularly providing training to the farmers. PGI-VER, Jaipur is also organizing various training programmes for capacity building of livestock farmers. CVAS, Navania situated in the south campus of the University is continuously conducting trainings for the tribal farmers' especially tribal women for sheep & goat husbandry, fish farming and backyard poultry.

All the above efforts of RAJUVAS are targeted for the benefit of the end users, i.e., livestock farmers, which I hope will be provided with new technologies for sustainable animal production so that Rajasthan may step in the First place in all respects of animal production, i.e., milk, meat, wool and egg production.

Activities

Sensitization Workshop on Sustainable **Production from Indigenous Cattle**

Sensitization workshop on "Sustainable Production from Indigenous Cattle" was organized at PGI-VER, Jaipur from 6-7 October 2014. About 120 participants from RAJUVAS, Department of Animal Husbandry, Goshalas, KVKs, NGOs and other related organizations took part in this workshop and discussed realistic problems and initiatives for the improvement and advancements of Indigenous cattle in State of Rajasthan. Milk Quality Testing and Safety Laboratory

Sh. Prabhu Lal Saini, Hon'ble Minister of Agriculture and Animal Husbandry along with Prof. A.K. Gahlot, Vice-Chancellor inaugurated the "Milk Quality Testing and Safety Laboratory" at PGI-VER, Jaipur on 7th October, 2014. Sh. Ashok Sampatram, Additional Chief Secretary- Agriculture, Sh. Abhay Kumar Secretary-Animal Husbandry and Sh. Pritam Singh MD-RCDF also graced the occasion. The creation of state of art facility for analysis of various pollutants and adulterants in milk employing recent biotechnological tools for monitoring of various adulterants and environmental pollutants like heavy metals, antibiotic residues, pesticide residues and other common adulterants and investigation on milk of native breeds and value addition will go a long way for improving status of dairy enterprise in the State.
