सर्वाधिक पशुधन संपदा वाला राष्ट्र ही सम्पन्न : माननीय राज्यपाल श्री कल्याण सिंह

माननीय राज्यपाल एवं कुलाधिपति श्री कल्याण सिंह ने कहा है कि पशुचिकित्सा के क्षेत्र में उल्लेखनीय कार्य करके वेटेनरी विश्वविद्यालय ने नए कीर्तिमान स्थापित किए हैं। यह आगे बढ़कर भारत वर्ष का पहला विश्वविद्यालय बनेगा जहां पशुओं को आधुनिकतम चिकित्सा सुविधा मिलेगी। उन्होंने राजुवास के कुलपति प्रो. ए.के. गहलोत के नेतृत्व में किए जा रहे कार्यों को सराहा। राज्यपाल 11 दिसम्बर, 2015 को वेटेनरी विश्वविद्यालय में "पशुपालकों से संवाद" कार्यक्रम को सम्बोधित कर रहे थे। माननीय कुलाधिपति ने वेटेनरी विश्वविद्यालय में वर्षा जल संग्रहण तंत्र से सिंचाई कार्य का उद्घाटन किया और देश में अपनी किस्म के पहले सजीव पशु जैव विविधता म्यूजियम का अवलोकन किया। उन्होंने

में आधुनिक सुविधाओं से युक्त पशुपालक विश्रामगृह का लोकार्पण भी किया। माननीय राज्यपाल ने कहा कि कृषि प्रधान देश भारत में पशुधन का विशेष महत्व है। उन्होंने कहा कि लोग कहते हैं कि जिस देश के पास जितना अधिक सोना होता वह देश उतना ही संपन्न होता है लेकिन उनकी मान्यता है कि जिस देश में अधिक पशुधन होता है वही संपन्न बन सकता है। पशुओं से दुग्ध उत्पादन और पशु-पक्षियों के विकास से ही किसान का आर्थिक हित साधन का काम होता है। देश में जमीन ज्यादा है, लेकिन खेती कम है। ऐसे में किसान की आजीविका का साधन पशुधन और दुग्ध उत्पादन है। कार्यक्रम के प्रारम्भ में कुलपति प्रो. ए.के. गहलोत ने कहा कि राज्य में पशुधन आधारित अर्थव्यवस्था के मद्देनजर पशुधन
