From Vice-Chancellor's Desk


Dear Readers,

Activities

Hon'ble CM of Rajasthan Smt. Vasundhara Raje Visited RAJUVAS under 'Sarkar Aapke Dwar' Programme

In a move to strengthen the grievance redressal system in the state, Smt. Vasundhara Raje - led Rajasthan government visited the Bikaner Division from 19th to 30th June 2014 under 'Sarkar Aapke Dwar' (government at your doorstep) programme. As part of the programme, public hearings and cabinet meetings were held at the divisional level to address people's grievances and take up development issues of the region. The district administration identified Rajasthan University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences (RAJUVAS) as a campus for holding the various meetings of secretaries, ministers and other staff. This was a rare occasion for the RAJUVAS to host such a prestigious meeting at their campus. A series of meetings planned by Govt. of Rajasthan included a briefing meeting by Hon'ble CM Smt. During the visit of State Govt. under "Sarkar Apke Dwar" various Ministers and Secretaries visited RAJUVAS campus and LRS, Kodamdesar.

Hon'ble Chief Minister Smt. Vasundhara Raje visited Livestock Research Station, Kodamdesar of the University on 29th June, 2014. Hon'ble CM took the account of progress of various research schemes on Kankarej & Sahiwal cattle, Marwari goat and Magra sheep. VC Prof. A. K. Gahlot accompanied the Hon'ble CM while taking her round to various schemes and briefed about the objectives and progress of schemes as well as University. Hon'ble CM was very much impressed with production levels of Sahiwal and Kankarej cows. At this occasion, Hon'ble CM was briefed about the hydroponics project where green fodder is produced without soil. Smt. Raje appreciated the green fodder production through hydroponics technology. Farmers Advisory in Lieu of Weak Monsoon

A meeting of officials of Department of Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, SKRAU and RAJUVAS was conducted on 27 June, 2014 under the Chairmanship of Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot in response to advisory issued in lieu of weak monsoon by National Rainfed Area Authority, Planning Commission, Govt. of India. Overall the monsoon system was quite weak and its advancement towards North is delayed by about 8-15 days in different parts of the country. In this meeting, monsoon rainfall scenario upto 24 June, 2014 has been reviewed and the animal husbandry advisory issued accordingly. Keeping in view the current rainfall situation, RAJUVAS identified green fodder production, animal health care, migration of livestock to neighboring states, efficient use of available water resources and prevention of animal diseases, as top most priority for livestock owners. The farmers were advised to undertake all possible efforts for sustainable livestock production in current rainfall situation.



Grant for Library Strengthening

ICAR, New Delhi has released sanction of the Council amounting to Rupees Seventy five lacs only under the scheme 'library strengthening' for the year 2014-15 to RAJUVAS, Bikaner for meeting the expenditure to be incurred on library, library resources, e-sources other than CeRA, university level text and reference books, and strengthening of ICT tools and platforms.

Release of PGI-VER Logo and RKVY Project Publication

On 15th May 2014, occasion of foundation day of RAJUVAS, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot has released logo of PGI-VER, Jaipur in the presence of Prof. Vishnu Sharma, Dean and other faculty members. Vice-Chancellor also released the publication entitled "Pashuon Ke Liye Vardaan -Kshetriya Vishishta Khanij Mishran" prepared by Prof. Sheela Choudhary under RKVY Project for various districts i.e. Jaipur, Dausa, Ajmer and Tonk.



Injured Bird Treatment Camp

On the occasion of Akshaya-Tritiya, when kite flying is a big event, large number of birds get injured. To provide treatment facilities for such birds, RAJUVAS has organized a free bird treatment camp in the TVCC, Bikaner for three days i.e. 2-4 May, 2014. A total of twenty-four injured birds were treated in this camp. Dr. Kapil Kachwaha, Dr. Mukesh Gahlot, Dr. Pradeep Abusaria, Dr. Subhash Gharu and Dr. Mahendra Tanwar provided their services under the guidance of Prof. T.K. Gahlot, Director Clinics.

"Dhine Re Batyaa" from 17 AIR Stations of Rajasthan

RAJUVAS has started a new extension programme "Dhine Re Batyaa" for livestock owners from All India Radio, Bikaner from 10th January 2013 and is broadcasted on Thursday of every week at 7:15 to 7:45 PM. Looking to the popularity of this programme in livestock owners, RAJUVAS started to broadcast this programme from 17 All India Radio Stations of Rajasthan from 15th May, 2014. In this radio programme new technologies, schemes and initiatives taken in the field of veterinary & animals husbandry are provided through varta, discussions and songs. A specialist from the University replies the queries and issues related to the livestock owners.

Animal Infertility Treatment Camp

Animal infertility treatment camp was organized by CVAS, Bikaner in collaboration with Shri Krishan Go Sewa Sansthan on 19th May, 2014 at village Bandnav, Sardarsahar. A total of 60 infertility cases were treated during the camp. Overwhelming response of livestock owners of this area was reported at the camp. Prof. J.S. Mehta, Prof. G.N. Purohit, Dr. Pawan Kumar Suniya, Dr. Ashutosh Tripathi and 25 veterinary students provided their services in the camp.

NCC Rally on World No Tobacco Day

Every year, on 31st May, WHO and partners mark World No Tobacco Day, highlighting the health risks associated with tobacco use and advocating for effective policies to reduce tobacco consumption on this date. NCC cadets of RAJUVAS made a rally around the campus with play cards, banners and posters discouraging people from taking up smoking as well as tobacco. Many public people also joined the rally. Prof. R.N. Kachwaha, DSW organized this rally. The main intention of this rally was to draw the attention of young people to the widespread prevalence of tobacco use and to negative health effects.

RPVT-2014

RPVT was conducted at seventeen centres at Bikaner for a total of 8520 students, out of which 7187 students appeared in the exam. RAJUVAS invited online applications for RPVT-2014 from 4th April, 2014 from eligible candidates of Rajasthan domiciles only. The result of RPVT-2014 was declared on 30 June, 2014. The RPVT 2014 Convenor was Dr. Hemant Dadhich, Prof. & Head, Dept of Pathology, CVAS, Bikaner.

What's New?

Indoor Facility for Injured Birds

TVCC of CVAS, Bikaner has developed indoor facility for injured birds for treatment & recovery. A large number of birds particularly pigeon are injured during kite flying season and are brought for treatment. A two-tier cage has been developed which has facility for water & food also. TVCC is planning to create another facilities for big birds like peacocks by modifying its prevailing indoor ward for small animals. This facility has been created under the guidance of Prof. T.K. Gahlot, Director Clinics.

Appointment of New Faculty in RAJUVAS

After approval from the BOM on 13th June 2014, University issued appointment letters to 108 teachers to join their respective place of posting. Fifteen Assistant Professors at CVAS, Bikaner, 2 Associate and 7 Assistant Professors at CVAS, Navania and 4 Assistant Professors at PGI-VER, Jaipur joined their services at the end of June.

NMPS Project Started at Chittorgarh Farm

A project under National Mission on Protein Supplement (NMPS) has been started at Chittorgarh farm. About 300 Sirohi Goats has been shifted at this farm. Land development and renovation works is under progress. Dr. R.K. Nagda, Dean, CVAS, Navania is the Principal Investigator of this project.



Trainings Organized

Training on Imaging Diagnosis of Animals

Trainings to the 22 Veterinary Officers and Livestock Assistants of the Department of Animal Husbandry on Imaging Diagnosis of Animals (X-ray and Ultra-sonography) were organized in the Department of Veterinary Surgery and Radiology, CVAS, Bikaner from 5-7 May, 2014. Participants were trained on highly sophisticated ultra-sonography machine, X-ray unit and other diagnostic facilities available at RAJUVAS. Prof. T.K. Gahlot, Director Clinics coordinated this training.
