Continuing our commitments to serve the cause of livestock owners and the veterinary fraternity of the state, many actions were initiated in this quarter, obviously with a focus on animal welfare and veterinary education. In our effort to provide almost a 'single window' to address various problems of livestock owners, University conducted events bringing together experts from SAU's, ICAR Institutes, KVK's, autonomous bodies and Department of Animal Husbandry of the state, at one platform. "KRISHAK-VAIGYANIK-SAMVAD', a mega event, organized at village Dhani Pandusar of Lunkaransar Tehsil, with a participation of more than 2000 animal owners, to provide various veterinary services, especially treatment of infertility in animals, was one such event. This assumes special significance in context of rising buffalo and dwindling sheep population in Bikaner region. were some other such steps. Various activities to empower students, both physically and academically, have also been initiated. 'Smart Class Rooms' are being added. 'Spoken English' modules and new syllabus like 'Technical Writing and Communication Skills' have been introduced. As the saying goes, "A Healthy Mind Resides in a Healthy Body", a well equipped gymnasium has come on the campus and a modern volleyball ground has also been added to the existing recreational facilities. Students were addressed by HR professional of Army and Industry to expose them to the employment options in these sectors. Placement Cell arranged a series of preparatory and motivational lectures from professionals to prepare students for a vast job market. Some fruits were born immediately, as appreciable numbers of graduates have been hired by a leading dairy of Gujarat. With the setup of new Student's Union in the University, I look forward for a strong symbiotic relationship between faculty and the students. We are keen to transform each student into a 'gentle-man veterinarian'. Academic and cultural celebrations, the lifeline of any University, went on with usual zeal and fervour, noteworthy being celebration of World Zoonotic Day and World Rabies Day.

RAJUVAS faculty, posted at PGE-RCLHP, Jaipur had an opportunity to interact and share progress of the University with H.E. Mrs Margaret Alva, Governor, State of Rajasthan and Chancellor RAJUVAS. Sh. Ram Narain Meena, Hon'ble Deputy Speaker, Rajasthan State Legislative Assembly, Sh. Brijender Singh Soopa, Chairperson, Livestock Development Board and Dr. K.M.L Pathak, DDG, ICAR, also visited RAJUVAS in this quarter and had interactions with faculty.

In previous issue of Newsletter, I emphasized that the Road map for RAJUVAS is all set upto 2017, but shortage of man power is a hurdle! Administrative Decisions

Meeting of Board of Studies

Meeting of Board of Studies of faculty of Veterinary and Animal Science was held on 28th August 2012 at CVAS, Bikaner under the chairmanship of Faculty Chairmen & Dean Dr. B.K. Beniwal. In this meeting, the proceedings of the previous meeting held on 2nd June 2012 were approved and appointment of University Heads was recommended for all the Departments. It was also decided to establish a Publication Division in the University for publications of theses, practical manuals, training manuals, study materials and booklets as university publications. All the Head of Departments and Conveners of Committee of Courses attended this meeting.

4th Meeting of Academic Council

The 4th Meeting of Academic Council of RAJUVAS was held on 3rd September 2012 at Bikaner. The meeting was chaired by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot. New rules for affiliation of private veterinary colleges & animal husbandry diploma institutes were adopted. Qualifications for direct recruitment on the posts of Professor, Associate Professor and Assistant Professor and score card for CAS as well as fresh recruitment were approved. Syllabus for farm practice & hospital practice courses for AHDP was also approved. Newly introduced advisory system to promote involvement of students in academics & extracurricular activities was approved.

7th Meeting of Board of Management

The 7th Meeting of Board of Management of RAJUVAS was held on 9th September 2012 at CVAS, Navania (Vallabhnagar) Udaipur campus of RAJUVAS under the chairmanship of Vice- Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot. Since members of BOM were visiting Navania campus for the first time, they were taken around the campus and were briefed on various ongoing projects & teaching activities. Members of BOM expressed satisfaction on the facilities developed at CVAS, Navania and considered the entire complex as a boon for all out development of this tribal area. BOM approved qualifications for direct recruitments/promotions of teaching & non-teaching staff of RAJUVAS. All the orders issued by the university, as action taken on the recommendations of previous BOM meeting, were also approved. At this occasion Sh. R.N. Meena, Hon'ble Deputy Speaker of Rajasthan Legislative Assembly laid foundation stone for girls hostel with a capacity to accommodate 50 students. In this meeting RAJUVAS Newsletter Volume-3 Issue-2 was also released by the members of BOM. At this occasion a plantation drive was also organized.

Meeting with H.E. Governor of Rajasthan

Dr. Tikam Chand Meena a student of e-governance certificate, IIM Indore, addressed University teachers and students on establishment of e-Animal Science Kiosk in the state. Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot emphasized that, in this era of globalization, institutions are facing challenges and responsibilities to finish their work efficiently. E-governance could be a useful medium and helps in developing centralized and transparent system. E-



governance replaces all human controlled activities like storage, processing and execution of information as it is automatic. It also provides its support to present system in decision making process, in communication and in executing the decision. E-Animal Science Kiosk is an important technique for fast solution of the problems of livestock owners. Dr. B.K. Government of Rajasthan has also issued administrative and financial sanction of Rs. 53.50 lacs for the year 2012-13 for this NCC Regiment. This regiment will have 26 horses. The students will be trained for riding and equestrian events. RAJUVAS is providing all infrastructure facilities to establish this unit.

Krishak Vaigyanik Samwad and Infertility cum Health Camp







A one day mega Krishak Vaigyanik Samwad on "Livestock Management in Arid Area- A Challenge" was organised by RAJUVAS in joint collaboration of Central Wool Development Board, Jodhpur at Dhani Pandusar, Lunkaransar on 24th August 2012. In this programme, lectures on different subjects by various subject matter specialists, were delivered amongst a huge gathering of around more than 2000 farmers and about 500 officials from different line departments. Several exhibitions of different organisations of Bikaner such as RAJUVAS, SKRAU, CSWRI, CAZRI, NRCC, NRCE, CIAH, RCDF, URMUL, State Agriculture & Animal Husbandry departments were arranged at the occasion. Along with this, infertility cum health camp was also organized in which a total of 557 cases of cattle, sheep, goat, camel, etc. were treated. Dewormer and mineral mixture were also distributed to the farmers at the camp. Facilities for examination of soil and water samples were also made available. At this occasion a booklet entitled "बीकानेरी चोकला भेड़ : आय का उत्तम साधन" written by Dr. S.C. Goswami, Dr. C.K. Murdia, Dr. Vijay Kumar and Dr. B.S. Saini was also released by the Guests, which will prove very useful for sheep breeders in scientific management of sheep herds and they would be more benefitted by adoption of sheep husbandry practices as their livelihood. The Chief Guest of the programme was Sh. Virendra Beniwal, Hon'ble Transport and Home Minister for State Rajasthan Government and the programme was presided over by Prof. A. K. Gahlot, VC, RAJUVAS, Bikaner. Special Guests of the function were Dr. C.K. Murdia, Director Extension Education, Dr. B.K. Beniwal, Dean, CVAS, Bikaner, Mr. Y.K. Singh, Registrar and Comptroller, RAJUVAS, Bikaner, Sh. Shyodana Ram, Pradhan, Lunkaransar Panchayat Samiti and Smt. Gomti Devi, Sarpanch Dhani Pandusar. Under SWIS running in the RAJUVAS sponsored by the CWDB, 111 villages belonging to 41 panchyats of Bikaner and Lunkaransar tehsils were surveyed & 1656 sheep breeders possessing 202529 sheep were registered. A total of 448 rams of Bikaneri Chokla sheep were distributed amongst them. The registered sheep breeders were provided health services through organizing treatment camps. Registered farmers were also benefitted through distribution of animal feed and mineral mixture to be given to pregnant ewes for 90 days before lambing as improved management practices. Dr. S.C. Goswami, PI, SWIS Project organized this mega event.

Interface Meeting on Dang Area Development

Interface meeting on Dang Area Development was organized at PGE-RCLHP, Jaipur on 25th August, 2012. Total 45 participants attended the meeting; prominent among them were Sh. Meena, Dr. Sheela Choudhary from PGE-RCLHP, Jaipur organized this meeting.



Interface of Rajasthan KVK's of Zone-VI on Livestock Infertility

The State of Rajasthan has precious livestock germplasm in the form of very good livestock breeds. The buffalo population has increased very significantly during last ten years. Therefore, it is very essential to reduce the incidences of infertility in livestock in order to have high milk production from animals. KVK's of Rajasthan can play a key role to transfer recently developed livestock technology (NDRI) at grass-root level in order to benefit the marginal and small livestock owners. Thus, an Interface



of Rajasthan KVK's of Zone-VI on Livestock Infertility was organized by RAJUVAS at ARS, Durgapura, Jaipur on 9th August 2012. Dr. B.S. Prakash, ADG (AN&P), ICAR, New Delhi was the Chief Guest. Sh. O.P. Meena, Additional Chief Secretary, Animal Husbandry & Dairying and MD, RCDF, Jaipur, Prof. A.K. Gahlot, Vice Chancellor, RAJUVAS, Bikaner and Dr. O.P Gill, Vice-Chancellor, MPUAT, Udaipur were the Special Guests. Dr. Y.V. Singh, Zonal Project Director, Zone-VI Jodhpur had also graced the occasion. Scientists from ZPD, Zone-VI, MPUAT, Udaipur, SKRAU, Bikaner, RAJUVAS, Bikaner, officials from Department of Animal Husbandry, officials from RCDF and SMS (Animal Science/Veterinary Science), Programme Coordinators of 42 KVK's of Rajasthan had participated in the workshop. A total of 87 participants attended this interface. Two technical publications, "Science and Art of Feed Formulation" and "Body Condition Scoring" written by Dr. Vishnu Sharma and Dr. Sanjita Sharma, Associate Professors, PGE-RCLHP, Jaipur were released on this occasion. Dr. C.K Murdia, Director, Extension Education, Bikaner organized this event in collaboration with PGE-RCLHP Jaipur.

Presentation of Status Report of Dang Area Development

Krishak Samman Samaroh



CVAS, Bikaner

On the occasion of World Rabies Day, a Rabies Vaccination and Awareness Camp was organized on 28th September, 2012 by CVAS, Bikaner in collaboration with Canine Welfare Society, Bikaner. In this camp 60 dogs were vaccinated against Rabies. 250 pamphlets were distributed among the dog owners on precautions and cure of Rabies. Dr. Anil Ahuja, Head, Department of Veterinary Clinical Medicine, CVAS Bikaner as secretary organized this camp for the benefit of dog lovers at Bikaner campus.



PGE-RCLHP, Jaipur in collaboration with Humane Society International and Help in Suffering (Both NGO's) organized a one day seminar on World Rabies Day. A total of 52 delegates from various Govt. & Non-Govt. agencies participated. Dr. P.K. Mehrotra, Director, PGE-RCLHP, Jaipur presented a status paper on Rabies in men and animals. Dr. Jack from HIS made a presentation on birth control programme being run by HIS for street dogs and he presented the statistical figures in support of his observations regarding gradual decline in street dog population in Jaipur city and incidences of dog bites/rabies in human population. Dr. Sunil Chawla from Humane Society International briefed the house about worldwide activities of this NGO in combating Rabies and also animal welfare activities.
