Dear Readers,

I take this opportunity to inform that RAJUVAS had one more Feather in the Cap by conducting interviews of faculty for various disciplines of Veterinary & Animal Sciences. It is a historic moment that after May 1996, veterinary faculty will have the young recruited human resource in teaching, research and extension wings. It will strengthen the activities of RAJUVAS especially in the newly established VUTRCs which will be the flag bearers of the University in each district of the State. RAJUVAS realizes very well the responsibility entrusted to it by the State Government and take onus to propel animal husbandry led growth by providing quality resources in all designer frames, innovations, technologies and their extension in concerted manner to make the State a leader in the Country. The Livestock Feed Resource Management and Technology Centre of the University is regularly publishing quarterly Pashu aahar evam chara bulletin, informing the

livestock owners about the price status of feed & fodder, estimates of fodder production on the basis of actual sowing and production of the feed & fodder in the State. It is also publishing monthly package of practice to be adopted by farmers for green fodder production. Ultra-modern State level Feed Analysis Laboratory is being established at Bikaner for testing the quality of different feed stuffs. This laboratory will cater the need of entire state for the purpose of quality analysis of feed and fodder as well as providing consultation to various agencies and farmers. Now, RAJUVAS has given focus on pasture development and green fodder production under RKVY. In the same context, a hydroponics demonstration unit at CVAS Bikaner is producing green fodder, which is supplied for feeding to the cows of LRS, Bikaner and this technology is demonstrated to Farmers. Similar machines are being established at CVAS, Navania-Vallabhnagar (Udaipur) and PGIVER, Jaipur. An Advanced Milk Testing and Research Laboratory has been established at PGIVER, Jaipur for testing of milk for quality, presence of insecticide-pesticide and drug residues, adulteration, presence of highly pathogenic microbes in the milk etc. Establishment of this laboratory is included in sixty days work plan announced by Hon'ble Chief Minister Mrs. Vasundhara Raje. Other targets given for sixty days work plan of Hon'ble Chief Minister are- Foundation stone laying of Sahiwal cattle breeding farm and project on pasture development and green fodder production at LRS, Kodamdesar (Bikaner); inauguration of rain water harvesting system, technology museum, hydroponics technology machine and advanced feed fodder testing laboratory at CVAS Bikaner; inauguration of Hydroponics technology machine at CVAS, Navania, Vallabhnagar; Foundation stone laying of Veterinary Clinical Complex of PGIVER at Jamdoli (Jaipur); inauguration of Advanced Milk Testing and Research Lab at PGIVER, Mansarovar, Jaipur and MOU of RAJUVAS with Ayurved University Jodhpur for Panchgavya research.



National Conference on Veterinary Anatomy Vision-2050

National Conference on "Veterinary Anatomy Vision 2050- improvement, challenges and opportunities in relation to animal as well as human health and biodiversity" was organized by RAJUVAS under the aegis of Indian Association of Veterinary Anatomy from 8-10 January, 2014. One hundred and ninety three delegates from the different parts of the country participated in the symposia including seventy-four students. The Chief Guest of inaugural function Dr. H.P. Vyas, Vice-Chancellor, Bikaner Technical University called upon the scientists to develop techniques for improvement of the milk production like the other developed countries. Prof. A.K. Gahlot, Vice-Chancellor, RAJUVAS delivered his keynote address on the topic "Future of Veterinary Anatomy. Dr. T.S. Chandrashekhar Rao, President IAVA, Dr. Ajay Prakash, Secretary IAVA, Prof. B.K. Beniwal, Dean, CVAS, Bikaner were the other dignitaries on the dais. During the conference, lifetime achievement award and academic awards were presented to different scientists and students. During three-days conference, technical sessions on different issues of veterinary anatomy were conducted to arrive at Veterinary Anatomy Vision 2050. In the valedictory function Mrs. Chandrakala Padia, Hon'ble Vice- Chancellor, MGS University, Bikaner was the Chief Guest. Dr. Geeta Beniwal, Treasurer of the symposium read the technical report and Dr. Rakesh Mathur, Organizing Secretary and Dr. Sanjeev Joshi, Co-Organizing Secretary of the IAVA Convention presented the vote of thanks.





Dog Show-2014

A dog show was organized by CVAS, Bikaner and Canine Welfare Society, Bikaner on 22nd February, 2014. The Chief Guest of the show was Maj. Gen. Anil Dare GOC, 24 Inf. Div. Bikaner. Superior Germplasm Distribution

Conservation and improvement of indigenous breeds of cows and buffaloes is going on at Livestock Research Stations of RAJUVAS, Bikaner. On these LRSs, male calves of high genetic potential especially for milk production are produced and reared. These male calves are distributed to the livestock owners and goshalas of different areas of Rajasthan at free of cost. Farmers and livestock owners are benefitted by increase in milk production and in turn improvement in economic conditions of the farmer. Thirteen Rathi bulls have been distributed under RKVY breed improvement programme in this quarter by Dr. Rajeev Joshi, Principal Investigator to farmers and goshalas.

Placement of "Garima Peti"

What's New

New Sub Centre of AICRP on Goats

A new cluster of Marwari goat at Kan Singh Ki Sid in the Bhap Tehsil of Jodhpur District was selected under All India Coordinated Research Project on Goat Improvement (ICAR). This center was inaugurated on 8th February, 2014 by Dean and Faculty Chairman Prof. B.K. Beniwal, Director Clinics Prof. T.K. Gahlot and Principal Investigator Prof. G.C. Gahlot. This sub-unit center was established with the aim to explore maximum genetic variation available in Marwari goat and to disseminate the pro-poor goat based technologies under field conditions. A minimum of 500 breedable does along with their followers will be covered by this field sub unit. The performance



recording on pedigree, growth, milk yield, reproduction, health etc. will be carried out on each animal adopted under the project. The bucks required for breeding will be given free of cost to registered goat farmers. After two-three breeding seasons bucks will be either replaced or rotated amongst clusters to avoid inbreeding for breed improvement. Adopted farmers will be motivated to rear superior male kids for sale as buck at latter stage. Health coverage including vaccination and deworming will be provided to all the goats in the project area.

Blood Bank Facility in TVCC

RAJUVAS has added yet another facility in the TVCC in the form of blood bank which will be initially used for canines and buffaloes. The facility is created by induction of a blood bank refrigerator which maintains the temperature upto 4°C and can store more than 100 units of blood. According to Director Clinics Prof. T.K. Gahlot, the cases of canine parvo infection and haemoglobinurea in buffaloes will be benefitted by this new facility.



Maharaja Ganga Singhji Trust, Bikaner has donated a digital X-ray called Computed Radiography equipment of Minolta-Konica Company to the Director Clinics, RAJUVAS for the purposes of use in the Radiology Division of TVCC of CVAS, Bikaner. Prof. T.K. Gahlot, Director Clinics told that with the introduction of this unit, the imaging section of TVCC has become ultramodern and high quality radiograph would benefit the small and large animals by precise diagnosis. The radiographs taken by this machine give very good diagnosis of thoracoabdominal region of cattle and buffaloes and cases of diaphragmatic hernia, traumatic reticulitis, and traumatic pericarditis are diagnosed with a precision and foreign bodies are clearly visible in the radiographs. Small animal thoraco-abdominal region





and skeleton shows most accurate and high precision images which help instant diagnosis of many disorders such as urinary calculi, pyometra, fractures, pneumonia, foreign bodies, tumours etc.
