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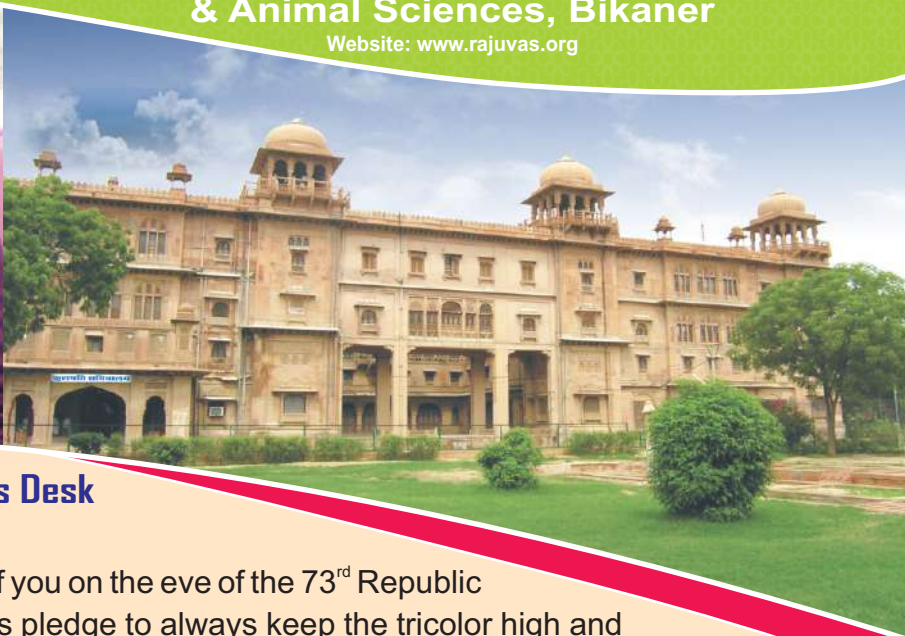
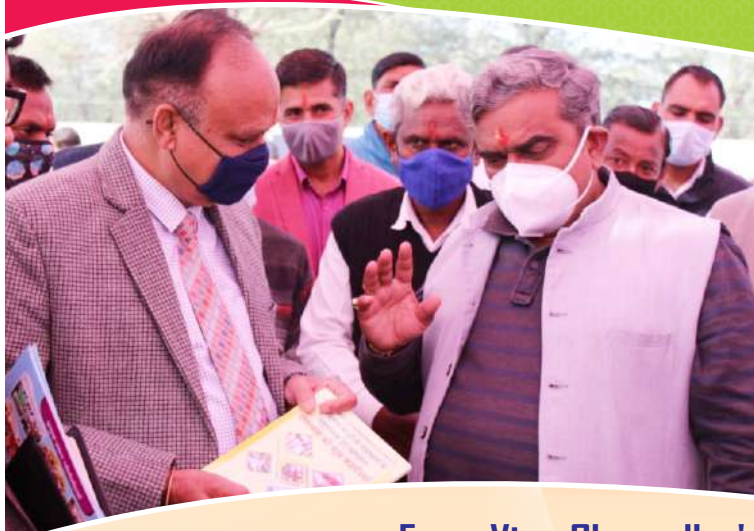

University Activities

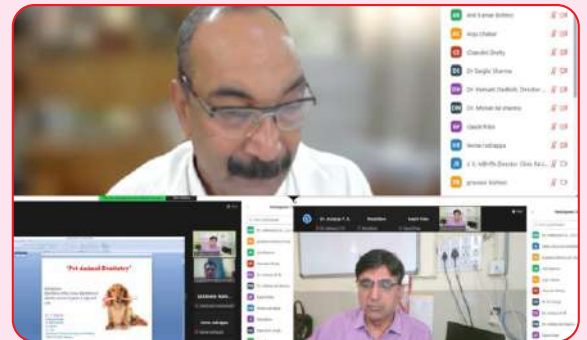
Foundation Stone Ceremony of Pashu Vigyan Kendra, Jobner (Jaipur)

On this occasion, Agriculture and Animal Husbandry Minister Sh. Lal Chand Kataria said that innovative technology should be developed so that production capacity of indigenous cows and other animals can be increased and youth should be inspired for adoption of animal husbandry based self-employment. Vice-Chancellor Prof. Satish K. Garg said that with the opening of this new Pashu Vigyan Kendra, the farmers and livestock farmers of this area will get direct benefit which will prove helpful in their economic upliftment. Add-on Certificate Course on Dentistry in Dogs and Cats

Add-on Certificate course of three months on Dentistry in Dogs and Cats was organized online for field veterinarians and veterinary graduates, post graduates and Ph.D students of University. Addressing the inaugural session, the Dean Prof. R.K Singh said that through these courses, not only the knowledge and skills of the students will be developed, but these courses will also be helpful in their future career development. Dr. Praveen Bishnoi, Coordinator of training said that this training is being organized under the Directorate of HRD, in which 17 participants from different states of the country are participating, who have to deal with the disorders related to the teeth of dogs and cats, their diagnosis and treatment.

Capacity Building and Skill Development

Faculty Development Training under NAHEP

Under the joint aegis of National Agricultural Higher Education Project and National Academy of Agricultural Research Management (NARM), Hyderabad, a 7 days online training was organized for 60 Assistant Professors of RAJUVAS on the topic "National Training Programme for Faculty Development". Training of Veterinary Officers under ASCAD Programme

Training on Processing of Cow Dung and Urine

Directorate of Extension Education, RAJUVAS organized one day training on processing of cow dung and urine on 26th February, 2022 in collaboration with Rajasthan Gau Seva Parishad, Bikaner. On this occasion, the Chief Guest, Divisional Commissioner Dr. Neeraj K. Pawan said that making pesticides from organic manure and cow urine will bring positive results on human life. Presiding over the program, Vice-Chancellor Prof. Satish K. Garg said that to University has submitted a project to make organic products from cow dung and cow urine. The farmers and livestock owners will be inspired by establishing its demo units in the LRSs, PVKs and other institutions of the University. National Convener, Rajasthan Goseva Parishad and former Vice-Chancellor Prof. A.K. Gahlot said that processing of cow dung and urine is a simple technique and cattle farmers will be able to earn profit by setting up such units in their homes or farms. This will be the first state in the country where its best start can be done. He said that the economic utility of the cow can be proved by the combination of science and faith. Director Extension Education Prof. R.K. Dhuria provided information about processing of cow dung and urine training campaign and extension programs of the university. Horticulture expert Dr. I.M. Verma trained the scientists in simple techniques of processing manures. Sh. Hem Sharma, President, Gau Seva Parishad also addressed the programme. Officer Incharges and Teaching Associates of Pashu Vigyan Kendras participated in the programme.



Workshop on Advanced Disease Diagnostics Techniques Under NAHEP

A workshop on Advanced Disease Diagnostic Technique in Animal Disease Diagnostics under NAHEP was organized by CVAS, Navania (Udaipur). Prof. B.N. Training on Diagnosis and Management of Infectious Diseases

Five-day training program was organized by Apex Center of Veterinary College, Bikaner on the topic Diagnosis in Animals and Chickens from 22-26 March, 2022. In concluding session, Dean Prof. R.K. Singh said that it is very important to identify the disease during the epidemic in animals, without which it is impossible to take steps to prevent epidemics. He said that if the disease is recognized at the proper time, its outbreak can be reduced and the livestock owners can be saved from economic loss. Director HRD Prof. B.N Shringi highlighted the importance of disease detection in field conditions and laboratories. Officer-in-Charge of Apex Centre Dr. J.P. Kachhawa informed that 32 SC students of the constituent and affiliated colleges of the RAJUVAS participated in this ICAR funded training. The training programme was supported by Dr. Taruna Bhati, Dr. Amit Pandey and Dr. Lokeshwar Singh.



Skill Development on Laghu Kukkut Palan
