#### Dear Readers,

Majority of the world's poor people live in rural areas, and most rural people depend on natural resources for their livelihood. Agriculture, animal husbandry and other natural resources are vulnerable to even slight change in climate and season. Increasing urbanization, industrial developments, deforestation, nuclear explosion etc., are some of the reasons of climate change. Due to change in climate, emergence of new diseases or outbreak of many viral as well as bacterial diseases is being noticed, which ultimately affect survivability of livestock and human beings. Recently, humans suffered from outbreak of Covid-19 which adversely affected not only world economy but human health too. In 2022, we faced the challenge of Lumpy Skin Disease in Cattle in some states including Rajasthan which adversely affected reproduction and production in cattle. As a result of

which whole milk and milk production chain was disturbed, which is yet to be smoothened? Although, to control the disease and mitigate the adverse effects, Government adopted many preventive measures but these seemed inadequate. During the period RAJUVAS constituted teams of experts to assist the State Animal Husbandry Department and suggested several preventive measures, which included vaccination and treatment of affected animal. Farmers were motivated and made aware about this outbreak through farmer advisory camps and gosthies at village level. Government of India and State Government have recognized the laboratory of PGIVER Jaipur as diagnostic centre for lumpy skin disease and other zoonotic diseases. To ensure human and animal health, we should ensure that ecological disturbances are not created and adopt all sorts of steps to conserve our natural resources so as to minimize man-made havoc which affect natural setting of eco-system.

# **University Activities**

An animal health camp for Lumpy Skin Disease was organized by Veterinary Clinical Complex RAJUVAS, Bikaner at Jalwali village on 13th September, 2022. Lumpy skin disease, parasitic infestations, pica, anoestrous cases were treated and given medicines in the health camp. Team of clinical departments with Intern, P.G. and PhD students actively participated in the camp.

## Intensified Efforts of RAJUVAS for the Control of Lumpy Skin

The RAJUVAS has intensified its efforts to prevent and control the infection of lumpy virus spreading in cows in different districts of Rajasthan. Vice-Chancellor Prof. Satish K. Garg said that the infection of lumpy virus is slowly spreading in all the districts of the state, which has become a cause of concern for the livestock farmers. The university has made efforts for sampling and prevention of infected animals by forming a team of veterinarians. Along with this, efforts were also made to control the infection situation in the gaushalas of the district by forming teams of college students and PG students. Along with this, advisory services were provided by the Pashu Vigyan Kendra and Krishi Vigyan Kendra through extension activities to the livestock farmers of the state for the control of lumpy infection.

#### Formation of Lumpy Skin Special Task Force

A special Task Force was formed at CVAS, Navania (Udaipur) regarding the lumpy skin virus under the aegis of Department of Animal Husbandry, Udaipur. Dean Prof. Rajiv Kumar Joshi and Dr. Bhupendra Bhardwaj, Joint Director Animal Husbandry formed a team of 30 veterinary officers and 60 students, under which the main task of spreading awareness about the disease lumpy skin virus among animals with treatment and vaccination in villages of Vallabhnagar area. Dr. Padma Meal from Animal Husbandry Department and Dr. Deepak Sharma, Assistant Professor, Department of Veterinary Microbiology played the key role.

#### Vice-Chancellor's Visit at PGIVER, Jaipur


#### **PGIVER**, Jaipur

#### Tiranga Rally on Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav



# **Capacity Building and Skill Development**

#### National Level Hands-on Orthopedic Training

A five-day Hands-on orthopedic training for field veterinarians on use of pinning and plating techniques in small animal (pets) fracture management was conducted by Department of Veterinary Surgery & Radiology, CVAS, Bikaner from 25-29 July 2022 under ICAR-AINP on DIMSCA. Addressing the closing session, the founder and former Vice-Chancellor of RAJUVAS Prof. A.K. Gehlot described the ongoing training under the DIMSCA project is very useful and looking at the importance of this training, skill dexterity in modern methods of surgery and treatment equipment have to be promoted.
