

## Academic Activities

### International Conference of Veterinary Anatomists

International Conference of the Indian Association of Veterinary Anatomists was organized at CVAS, Navania, Udaipur on the topic “Advancements in Anatomical Studies: The Stepping Stone in Transforming Livestock and Wildlife Sector while Achieving the Global Sustainable Development” from 20-22 December, 2022. On the inaugural day, Chief Guest of the conference was Dr. D.N. Sharma, Former Dean, Palampur Veterinary College. Founder and former Vice-Chancellor, RAJUVAS, Prof. A.K. Gehlot explained the importance of basic knowledge of anatomy in vetolegal and post mortem and appreciated the development of 2D and 3D modern techniques in anatomy practical study. Prof. Satish K. Garg, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, RAJUVAS, Bikaner in his presidential address shared the experiences of anatomy during his research period and explained the importance of anatomy in forensic science and stressed the need for interdisciplinary research in the present context. Secretary General, IAVA. Dr. Pawan Kumar presented the annual report of the society. President of Society Dr. P.V.S. Kishore emphasized the importance of electron microscopy studies for quality research in anatomy. A souvenir and a book on anatomy were released by the guests at the conference. Dean, Prof. R.K. Joshi welcomed all the guests and visitors and threw light on the development and activities of the college. The Chief Guest of the closing ceremony was Founder and Former Vice-Chancellor, RAJUVAS, Prof. A.K. Gehlot and Special Guest were Prof. Mohan Bhattacharya, Former Director, National Research Centre on Yak, ICAR. Total of 250 scientists, subject experts, field practitioners, research scholars and students belonging to various universities and research centres from the country and abroad participated in this conference and during the three days more than 100 Paper and poster were presented by subject experts in the 18 different sessions. Scientists were awarded various awards for their outstanding contribution in the field of anatomy and in different session for best paper and Poster presentation. The conference was organized by Prof. B.N. Meshram as Organizing Secretary IAVA.



### Initiation of Cow Dung and Urine Processing Trainings Campaign

A training campaign of processing of organic products of cow dung and urine was initiated by Directorate of Extension Education, RAJUVAS, Bikaner on 15<sup>th</sup> October, 2022. Divisional Commissioner Dr. Neeraj K. Pawan said that through the cow dung and urine training programme, not only the livestock owners will get financial benefits but such programme will increase the trend towards cow rearing among the livestock owners. Vice-Chancellor Prof. Satish K Garg said that products processed from cow dung and urine are the basis of natural farming. So, with the help of these trainings, farmer can get good income from processed cow dung and urine. It will not only be environment friendly but will also be an additional source of income for farmers. Prof. R.K. Dhuria, Director Extension Education gave a welcome address and a detailed information about the cow dung and urine training campaign and informed that in this one-day training, a total of 16 Agriculture Officers and 10 Veterinary Officers attended training as master trainers. He informed that a total of 1410 farmers will be benefited from these trainings by organizing a total of 47 trainings in nine blocks of Bikaner district. Director Research SKRAU P.S. Shekhawat, Prof. I.M. Verma, and Sh. Kailash Chodhary, Deputy Director Agriculture were the keynote speakers. During this programme, Joint Director Agriculture Dr. Udaybhan, Joint Director Animal Husbandry Virendra Netra, President of Rajasthan Gau Seva Parishad Hem Sharma and Vice-President Sh. Arvind Middha were present. Officer In-charges of Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and RAJUVAS participated in the training programme.



**Awareness Lecture on Lumpy Skin Disease**

An Awareness lecture was organized on 28<sup>th</sup> December, 2022 for detailed information on prevention of lumpy skin disease in animals for final year and post graduate students. Dr. Naveen Kumar, Principal Scientist, National Equine Research Institute, Hisar provided detailed information to the students on prevention of lumpy skin disease spreading in animals. He shared his experiences on testing, manufacturing, production and effectiveness of indigenous vaccine to prevent lumpy skin disease and resolved the doubts of the students. Dr. Naveen also provided information about pre-preparation and safety measures to prevent such infectious diseases in future so that animal parents can be saved from financial losses.



**Infertility Treatment Camp**

Infertility treatment camp was organized by Department of Veterinary Gynaecology and Obstetrics, CVAS Bikaner at Beechwal on 19<sup>th</sup> October, 2022. Dr. Pramod Kumar, In-charge reported that a total of 67 animals were treated in this camp, which included infertility in animals, repeat breeding, cystic ovaries and artificial insemination. During this camp medicine was made available free of cost by Maharaja Ganga Singh Trust, Bikaner. The camp was organized under direction of by Director Clinics Prof. Praveen Bishnoi. Dr. Bhanu Prakash Dangi, Dr. Shivendra Bhalotia and villagers Dhanaram Tard, Sanwarmal and Usman cooperated in organizing the camp.
